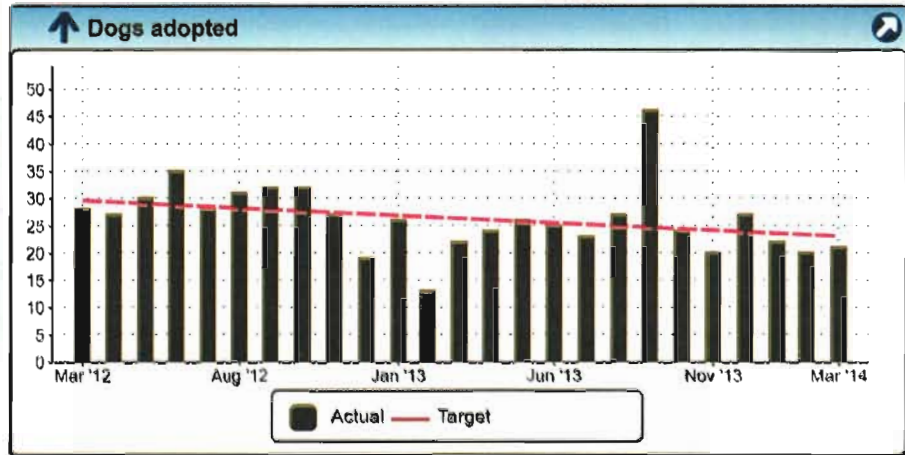

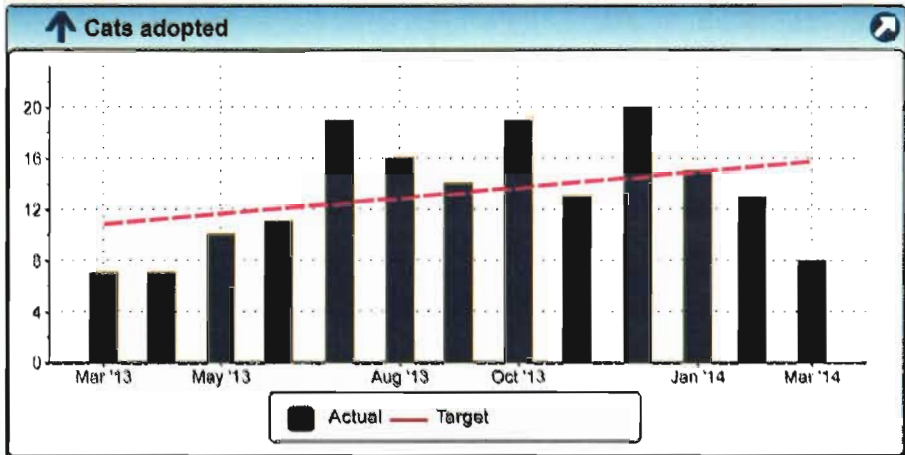

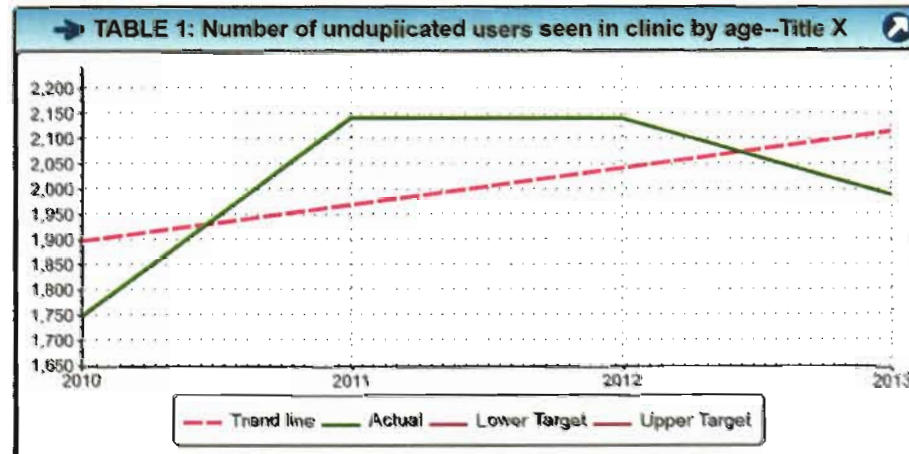

Clinical Services Division



During 2013, the Clinical Services Division provided discounted Title X Family Planning services to 1,989 unduplicated clients. Family planning and preventive health services were provided at a per client cost of \$240.00.

Forty percent of our Title X Family Planning clients were 24 years of age or younger; 34% were between 25-34 years of age and the remaining 26% were over 35 years of age.

Clinical Services' staff provided all methods of birth control from long acting to lesser effective methods.

FEMALES

- * 21% - Highly effective/long acting methods,
- * 50% - Moderately effective methods,
- * 13% - Utilized condoms or other less effective methods,
- * 10% - None - Pregnant, seeking pregnancy, or other reason,
- * 6% - Abstinent

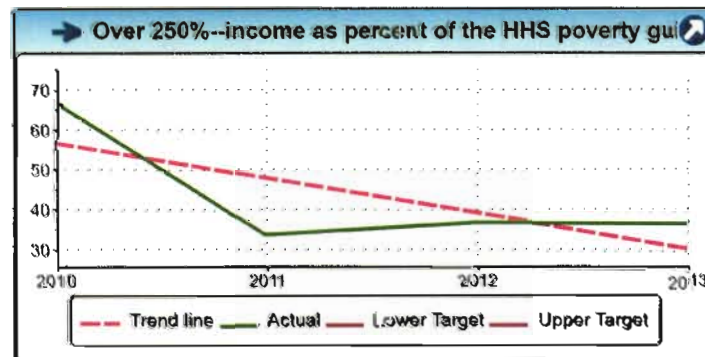
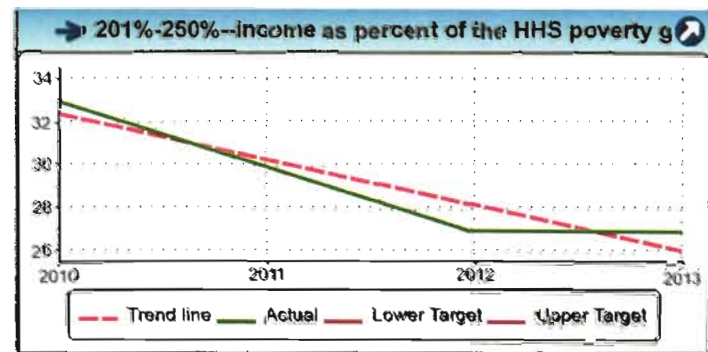
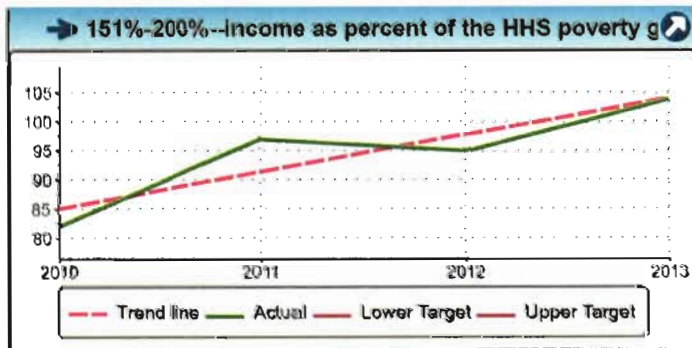
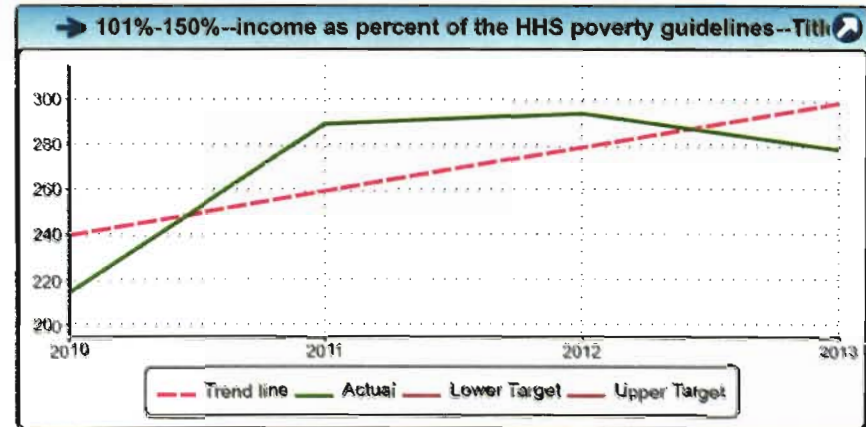
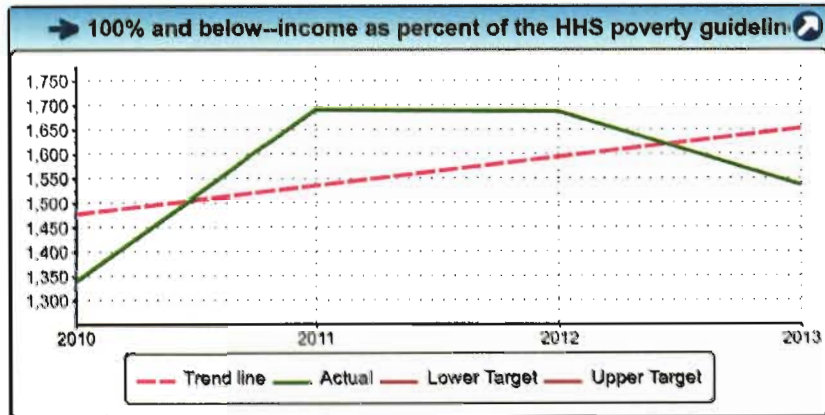
MALES

- * 38% - Condoms
- * 32% - Relied on a female method

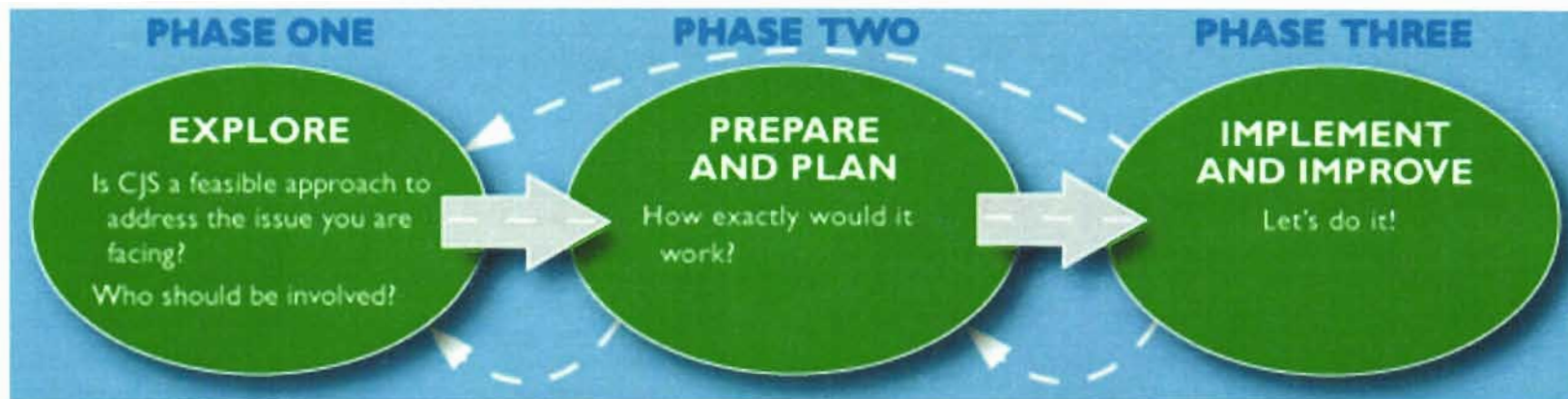

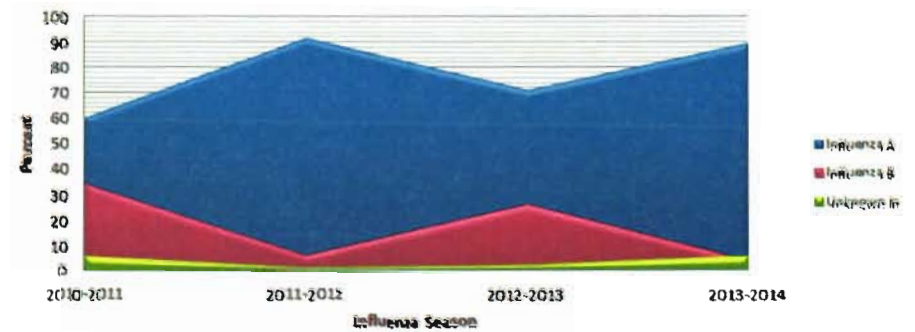

Public Health Emergency Preparedness

* For the budget period starting 7/1/14 -

- Public Health Preparedness (PHP) Grant - CCHHS has received a 10% cut in funding
- Hospital Preparedness (ASPR) Grant - CCHHS has received a 40% cut in funding

* Due to the 68% cut in the State Immunization Program funding for vaccine for the uninsured and the underinsured, CCHHS will not receive its allotment of vaccine to conduct the annual flu vaccination exercise in Carson City and Douglas County

- CCHHS will be focusing on increasing the number of flu vaccinations given through the following in order to bill Medicare, Medicaid, and our contracted private insurances companies -

- * School-Located Vaccination (SLV) programs,
- * Senior Centers and other senior facilities,
- * Group homes, and
- * Large employers.

- Co-chaired Northern Nevada Access and Functional Needs Workgroup - reviewing jurisdictional plans to provide feedback on addressing needs of vulnerable populations (seniors, pregnant women, visual and hearing impaired, etc.
- Judged presentations at the HOSA State Leadership Conference
- Conducted billing training for school-located vaccinations - finalizing policies and procedures for inclusion in IZ Billing toolkit
- Participated in planning meetings for the review and revision of the Epidemiology Disease Investigation Manual
- Provided 27 vaccinations and education regarding flu, pneumonia and Tdap at the Mark Twain Community Center Health Fair
- Participated in the Carson Agency Action Network (CAAN) meeting
- Completed applications and budgets for Budget Period 3 of the Community Public Health Preparedness and the Hospital Preparedness Programs
