Use Available Funds This Fiscal year

- Last meeting, we asked TRAFCC for input regarding funds available this fiscal year.
- Available, uncommitted funds now total about \$600,000
 - RTC funds due to positive contractor bids
 - Streets funds due to budget decision to not fund truck garage and fueling facility
- Evaluating alternatives for use of funds
 - Safety improvements – pedestrian crossings
 - Sidewalk improvements – maintenance/ADA
 - Pavement projects – reconstruction and additional alternatives

Use Available Funds This Fiscal year

- Pavement projects
 - Starting design for portion of Sonoma Street – Saliman to Halleck. Estimated cost of \$200,000.
 - Evaluating alternatives for additional pavement project(s)




Allocation of Funds in Future Years


Carson City Streets - Current Conditions
