SUBJECT: HRC-12-047 – Historic Preservation Fund Grant Update

The State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) completed its Historic Preservation Fund (HPF) grant selection for the 2013 calendar year on June 13, 2013 and granted Carson City \$6,000 for the Kings Canyon Cultural Resources Inventory. This granted amount was substantially less than the \$12,500 requested by Carson City. Carson City, along with the majority of the other HPF grant applicants, saw a reduction in requested funds due to the SHPO receiving close to \$100,000 less for 2013 funding versus the funding provided in 2012.

On June 20, 2013, staff and the Historic Resources Commission chairman attended a public meeting held by SHPO to discuss the awarded amounts and recommendations to several agencies on how they could stretch the awarded funding. SHPO staff suggested that Carson City consider using volunteers for the data collection portion of the Kings Canyon Cultural Resources Inventory. The Historic Resources Commission chairman stated that the data collection portion of the proposed inventory is not a large cost in the overall scope of work but that the report preparation is where the bulk of the budget would be spent. The chairman therefore suggested that the scope of work be modified to accommodate the reduced budget.

Staff is currently working with the HRC Chairman to revise the Kings Canyon Cultural Resources Inventory scope of work based on the awarded funding amount of \$6,000 for submittal to SHPO by July 20, 2013. After a revised scope is received by SHPO, they will create a new funding agreement for execution by Carson City.

Given the reduction of Carson City's HPF funding for 2013 by more than half the requested amount, staff would like to initiate a discussion with the Historic Resources Commission for potential HPF projects for the 2014 funding year. Staff had originally discussed completing the Andersen Ranch and Perini Ranch surveys for 2014, however, would like to discuss whether Historic Resources Commission feels there is value in finishing the remainder of the Kings Canyon Cultural Resources Inventory with the 2014 request for funding.

The State Historic Preservation Office finished its HPF grant selection for the 2013 calendar year and is pleased to announce that your organization has been awarded \$6,000.00. Enclosed is the preliminary list of awarded projects for the 2013 grant cycle. This list will be official after our public meeting mentioned below.

As required by the National Park Service, a public meeting has been scheduled to allow the general public an opportunity to comment on the recommended awards, and to make adjustments, if necessary. The 2013 HPF public meeting has been scheduled for June 20, 2013 at 10:00am in our office located at 901 S. Stewart St., Suite 5004. Please see a map included with this letter. Attendance at the public meeting is not mandatory. If unable to attend, comments submitted before June 19, 2013 will be read during the meeting. After the meeting, SHPO will finalize the grant distribution, emailing a final list to applicants.

Due to limited federal and state revenues, this award is less than the original requested amount. However, this office does have some recommendations that would stretch this limited grant and involve the numerous volunteers who value the Kings Canyon Road as a significant link in the region's transportation network. We look forward to discussing these recommendations in our kick-off meeting.

As administrator of this program, the State Historic Preservation Office would like to take this opportunity to point out several items of importance.

 The HPF award is from the National Park Service (NPS) and requires a minimum 40% contribution from the grantee. Note: This represents 40% of the entire project not of the federal grant funds;

Since we are dealing with multiple HPF grant years, it is very important to include your project number with all of your correspondence - emails, faxes, letters, memos, progress reports, and reimbursement requests.

This individual is your primary contact regarding this grant and all project communication should be directed to him/her.

- Project work as well as project costs should not be incurred or obligated until all participants have signed the funding agreement;
- 4. Your HPF award of \$6,000.00 will be available as soon as the following items have been completed:
- Submission of a Revised Scope of Work
 This should include the items your organization is planning on accomplishing with your HPF award. Please be as detailed as possible and include it in a list format.
- Submission of a Revised Itemized Budget
 This should reflect your HPF award and should be as detailed as possible. If the
 HPF award is part of a larger budget (e.g., if you are combining several funding
 sources), please make sure to identify the items that will be paid for by the HPF
 funds. The remainder will be considered match.
- If your grant award equals the amount requested in your application, please let your grant reviewer that the scope of work and budget has not changed.
- A Legal Property Description (only if working on a historic property)
 This is the legal description of the historic property where the work will be done and may be obtained from your local recorder's office.
- Main Project Contact Person
 If changes have been made since the application was submitted to our office, please
 let your grant reviewer know as soon as possible.
