Explanation for Recommended Board Action: Carson City is a community that values business and entrepreneurship. Economic Development Funding Policy

POLICY STATEMENT

The Consolidated Municipality of Carson City manages its municipal finances wisely, in accordance with Nevada law and in such a way as to provide for funding of the services provided to the public. It is the policy of the Consolidated Municipality of Carson City to fund economic development activities as investments into the Carson City economy which will generate operating revenue for the long-term provision of City services to its residents.

PURPOSE

This policy sets forth the use of certain City revenues for economic development activities, including economic development incentives, professional consulting services, public relations and other deemed appropriate by the Board of Supervisors.

IMPLEMENTING PROCEDURES

Funding for economic development activities shall be provided on an annual basis through the budget process. Sources of funding may come from any sources legally available for the Board of Supervisors to appropriate from.

The Carson City Landfill is a successful operation that provides operating profits for use for other City activities. Because economic development activities are an investment into the future financial health of Carson City, a portion of any profits generated by landfill operations shall be dedicated to those activities. Each year, when compiling the Annual Fiscal Year Budget for the ensuing year, an estimate of net profits received from Landfill Operations will be made. At the same time, a long term strategic assessment of economic development activities will be examined. Based upon this examination, a specific amount of funding from Landfill operations profits shall be identified and appropriated for economic development activities. In December of each year, and after completion of the annual financial audit, a report shall be provided to the Board of Supervisors reporting the actual profits received through Landfill operations. At that time, any adjustment to the current fiscal year budget for economic development activities may be made in order to recognize any variance between the projected and actual profits from Landfill operations.
