Staff Summary: City staff has applied for and received grant funds from the Carson Water Subconservancy District to plant native vegetation, control erosion and improve water quality around the existing asphalt parking lot, concrete boat ramp, and picnic area on City property commonly known as Carson River Park. If the Board of Supervisors approves this interlocal contract, it will allow City staff to begin implementation of the Phase II conceptual site development plan, approved on June 8, 2008. Explanation for Recommended Board Action: Carson River Park is a important component of the Unified Pathways Master Plan. It provides a "put in" facility for the Class I section of the water trail, as well as provide connectivity to land-based trails along the Carson River and Silver Saddle Ranch. On June 8, 2008, the Board of Supervisors approved Carson River Park's Phase II conceptual site development plan. A number of improvements are planned at this site including revegetation, a picnic shelter, additional picnic tables and parking, and interpretive signage. These grant funds from the Carson Water Subconservancy District will be specifically used to fund the revegetation of native grasses, shrubs, and trees around the existing asphalt parking lot, concrete boat ramp, and picnic area. INTERLOCAL CONTRACT

Addressing Funding From Subconservancy District To Carson City for Carson River Park Phase 2 Project

THIS CONTRACT dated this ____ day of _____, 2008, is entered into by and between CARSON CITY, a political subdivision of the State of Nevada and the CARSON WATER SUBCONSERVANCY DISTRICT, a political subdivision of the State of Nevada (hereinafter "CWSD").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, CARSON CITY is a governmental subdivision of the State of Nevada and therefore a public agency under NRS 277.100; and

WHEREAS, CWSD is a water subconservancy district created and organized under the provisions of Chapter 541 of NRS; and

WHEREAS, this Contract is entered into under the provisions of NRS 277.180 and accordingly must be ratified by appropriate official action of the governing body of each party as a condition precedent to its entry into force; and

WHEREAS, CARSON CITY is proposing to perform activities connected to the Carson River Park Phase 2 project; and described in Exhibit "A", attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, CWSD has agreed to set aside \$7,500.00 for fiscal year 2008-09 beginning July 1, 2008, and to grant CARSON CITY said amount in order to assist with the projects set forth in Exhibit "A".

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and of the mutual covenants herein contained, it is mutually agreed by and between the parties as follow:

- CWSD hereby grants to CARSON CITY up to \$7,500.00 for fiscal year
 2008-09 beginning July 1, 2008, and to grant CARSON CITY said amount
 in order to assist with the projects set forth in Exhibit "A
- CARSON CITY will submit requests for funding periodically over the fiscal year. The request for funding shall be accompanied by a description of what the funds were used for and shall reference this Contract.
- CWSD commits to pay the approved amount of the request to CARSON
 CITY within four (4) weeks of said request.
- 4. CWSD shall have no responsibility for costs exceeding \$7,500.00.
- 5. This Contract shall terminate June 30, 2009, at which time CARSON CITY shall have one (1) month thereafter to submit its final invoice for payment related to work performed under this Contract.
- 6. The parties will not waive and intend to assert available NRS chapter 41 liability limitations in all cases. Contract liability of both parties shall not be subject to punitive damages. To the extent applicable, actual contract damages for any breach shall be limited by NRS 353.260 and NRS 354.626.
- a. Consistent with paragraph 6 of this Contract, each party shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend, not excluding the others right to participate, the other party from and against all liability, claims, actions,

damages, losses, and expenses, including, but not limited to, reasonable attorneys fees and costs, arising out of any alleged negligent or willful acts or omissions of the indemnifying party, its officers, employees and agents. Such obligation shall not be construed to negate, abridge, or otherwise reduce any other right or obligation of indemnity which would otherwise exist as to any party or person described in this paragraph.

- b. The indemnification obligation under this paragraph is conditioned upon receipt of written notice by the indemnifying party within thirty (30) days of the indemnified party's accrual notice of any actual or pending claim or cause of action. The indemnifying party shall not be liable to hold harmless any attorneys' fees and costs for the indemnified party's chosen right to participate with legal counsel.

- 9. This Contract shall be by and between the parties hereto and shall not be assignable or transferable.
- 10. Any dispute regarding this Contract shall be decided according to the laws of the State of Nevada. If any part of this Contract is declared to be unlawful, any remaining obligations shall be deemed terminated.

- 11. This Contract may only be amended by consent of both parties. Any amendments must be written and executed with the same formality as this Contract.
- 12. This Contract constitutes the entire understanding between the parties and there are no representations, conditions, warranties or collateral agreements (expressed or implied), statutory or otherwise, with respect to the subject of this Contract.
- 13. This Contract becomes effective when it is ratified by the appropriate official action of the governing body of each party.
- 14. The parties hereto represent and warrant that the person executing this

 Contract on behalf of each party has full power and authority to enter into
 this Contract and that the parties are authorized by law to engage in
 cooperative action set forth herein.

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15. This Contract shall be entered into with duplicate originals, realizing that each entity, by necessity, must approve and execute the subject document at different dates, times and places.

PROJECT NAME: Carson River Park Phase 2 - Native vegetation (grasses, shrubs, and trees) enhancements for erosion control around the existing asphalt parking lot, concrete boat ramp, and picnic area.

PROJECT LOCATION:

Carson City, Nevada, at the Carson River. The project site is located on the south side of Carson River Road along the Carson River, just upriver from Lloyd's Bridge and adjacent to the Silver Saddle Ranch. Carson River Road is accessed from 5th Street in Carson City via U.S. Highway 395.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Briefly describe the project. Provide maps, drawings, photographs or other information. Additional sheets may be attached.

Carson City has adopted the Carson River Aquatic Trail into the Unified Pathways Master Plan. This plan identifies Carson River Park as a critical "put in" trailhead for the Aquatic Trail. In addition, Carson City adopted a Carson River Park Master Plan a number of years ago. Using this site development plan, Carson City has constructed in two previous phases various site amenities to enhance the public's recreational experience and stabilize the eastern riverbank within the park. Unfortunately, in the previous construction phases, the City was unable to afford the establishment of a permanent vegetation cover for the areas north, south, and east of the existing parking lot. Our department believes construction of a permanent irrigation system will enhance the survivability of the native plant material and will assist in controlling soil erosion into the Carson River. The City is <u>NOT</u> seeking funds from CWSD for the irrigation system. However, this grant application is requesting funds to purchase and install native vegetation for the area adjacent to and within the parking lot.

PROJECT BENEFITS: Briefly describe the benefits to be realized if the project is implemented. Additional sheets may be attached.

The project will benefit the Carson River by improving water quality due to the establishment of permanent native vegetation within park areas which currently do not have soil cover. By providing this native vegetation, the park

site will be better prepared to minimize rill and gully erosion during small storm events and protect the parking lot from being undermined with high river flows during large storm (flood) events. In addition, the proposed native vegetation will provide for wildlife habitat.

TOTAL ESTIMATED PROJECT COST: \$291,096

AMOUNT REQUESTED FROM CWSD: \$7,500




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ROCK CLIMBING PLAY ELEMENTS
