**Subject Title:** Action to direct the Parks and Recreation Department and the Office of Business Development to operate the Arlington Square Ice Skating Rink during the Winter of 2009-2010. (Roger Moellendorf and Joel Dunn)

**Staff Summary:** Approval to operate the Arlington Square Ice Skating Rink by the Parks and Recreation Department and the Office of Business Development will require an estimated \$135,405 subsidy from the City. It is projected that the Ice Skating Rink would operate for eight weeks starting on the Friday after Thanksgiving Day, November 27, 2009. Approval of the program will allow the City to provide this popular recreational activity to our residents and visitors again this winter.

**Recommended Board Action:** I move to direct the Parks and Recreation Department and the Office of Business Development to operate the Arlington Square Ice Skating Rink during the Winter of 2009-2010.

Explanation for Recommended Board Action: During the winter of 2008-2009 the Office of Business Development operated a downtown ice skating rink at the Arlington Square parking lot on Carson Street directly across the street from the Carson Nugget Casino. This program provided an economic stimulus to the downtown businesses while providing a popular recreational activity for Carson City residents and visitors. City staff feels this worthwhile project should be continued again this winter. Changes to the program include a collaborative effort between the Office of Business Development and the Parks and Recreation Department. The Office of Business Development will retain the promotion, marketing, and sponsorship recruitment tasks while the Parks and Recreation Department will manage the day-to-day operations of the ice rink including vendor contracts and the installation and striking of the rink. Attached is an estimated budget for the ice skating rink. It is projected that total expenses for the 2009-2010 season would amount to \$262,091 while revenues are estimated at \$126,686. This would require a projected subsidy of \$135,405. During the 2008-2009 season the Arlington Square Ice Skating Rink had 10,011 skaters.

**Explanation of Impact:** Expenses are estimated at \$262,091 and revenues are estimated at \$126,686 leaving a estimated subsidy of \$135,405.
