Staff Summary: In association with National Invasive Species Awareness Week held in Washington D.C., in January 2010, staff, in partnership with other agencies and organizations, wishes to promote local awareness and action to limit the impacts of invasive species. The campaign will include a presentation and resolution at the Board of Supervisors meeting, a banner across Carson Street throughout the following week, and several other events and activities.

Recommended Board Action: I move to adopt Resolution # _____ declaring Invasive Species Awareness Week from April 12 to April 17, 2010.

Explanation for Recommended Board Action: Invasive species threaten human and animal health, decrease native plant diversity and animal habitats, and negatively change river and riparian systems. To date, Carson City's efforts and funding have been towards the control of noxious weeds. Recently, there have become local concerns about the potential invasion and impacts of quagga mussels and zebra snails in the Carson River and Lake Tahoe. Beginning with a presentation and resolution at the Board of Supervisors meeting, staff and Margie Evans with the Carson City Weed Coalition will inform and educate the community regarding invasive and noxious weeds. One method of outreach includes a banner across Carson Street from April 12 to April 17, 2010. April is an ideal month because it correlates with other related events such as the fuels reduction with sheep, University of Nevada Cooperative Extension's Weed Warriors class, and the seasonal start for the ARRA (American Recovery and Reinvestment Act) weed crews. Additional outreach and education efforts include news articles in the Nevada Appeal and classroom sessions.

Any material expenses will be paid by the Carson Water Subconservancy District through the Watershed Program for weed removal and fuels reduction.

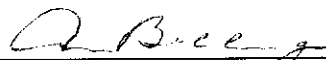

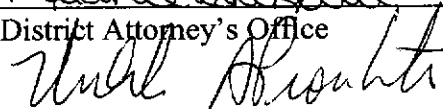

A RESOLUTION DECLARING INVASIVE SPECIES AWARENESS WEEK FROM APRIL 12-17, 2010, BY THE CARSON CITY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, CARSON CITY, NEVADA.

WHEREAS, Chapter 555 of the Nevada Revised Statutes provides for the control of insects, pest and noxious weeds; and
