

WATER, SEWERAGE AND DRAINAGE, CHAPTER 12.03, SEWER CONNECTION CHARGES AND USE RATES, SECTION 12.03.020, SCHEDULE OF RATES, BY INCREASING ALL RATES 14% AND OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATED THERETO. (Ken Arnold) Staff Summary: The proposed increase of rates reflected in Chapter 12.03 provide for the necessary revenue requirements to operate, maintain and meet debt obligations. More specifically, the changes provide for an across the board 14% increase to sewer use fees effective July 1, 2010 to the monthly rates for each property and septic haulers. Explanation: The sewer rates were increased a total of 5% as of July 1, 2009. That increase was necessary to simply meet existing debt service obligations and operational costs. Due to the need to fund certain capital projects at the Waste Water Reclamation Plant and to replace aging sewer mains, staff recommends a 14% increase as of July 1, 2010. The 14% rate increase requested is principally for a capital program debt service (13%) to cover costs for the North Lift Station Upgrades at the Waste Water Reclamation Plant (WWRP), Roop Street Sewer Line, pumps and motors for the WWRP and to cover increased operations and maintenance costs (1%) such as for fuel, electricity, and chemicals. Fiscal Impact: Upon approval of second reading, revenues will increase. Funding Source: Rates Explanation of Impact: Less debt financing will be required. AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 12, <u>WATER, SEWERAGE AND DRAINAGE</u>, CHAPTER 12.03, <u>SEWER CONNECTION CHARGES AND USE RATES</u>, SECTION 12.03.020, <u>SCHEDULE OF RATES</u>, BY INCREASING ALL RATES EFFECTIVE ON BILLS DATED ON OR AFTER JULY 1, 2010, AND OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATED THERETO.

Fiscal Impact: Increased Revenues to the Sewer Funds

THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF CARSON CITY DO HEREBY ORDAIN:

### SECTION I:

That Section 12.03.020 of the Carson City Municipal Code is hereby amended as follows:

#### 12.03.020 Schedule of rates.

- 1. The following schedule of rates for the sanitary sewer facilities and services furnished by or through, or for the use of, the Carson City sanitary sewer system, which rates are found and declared to be reasonable and just, taking into account and consideration the cost and value of the system and cost of maintaining and operating the system, and the proper and necessary allowances for the depreciation thereof and the amount necessary for the retirement of all bonds and other securities payable from revenues of the system, the accruing interest on all such securities, and reserves therefore are fixed, established, levied, imposed and otherwise prescribed in subsection (2) of this section.
- 2. The monthly rate for each property shall be computed as detailed in Schedule A of this section, unless otherwise required by this chapter.

Septic haulers shall be charged [thirty-one dollars and twenty seven cents (\$31.27); thirty two dollars and eighty-three cents (\$32.83) effective July 1, 2009] \$32.83; \$40.00 (eff. 7/01/10) for the first one thousand (1,000) gallons or fraction thereof plus [\$0.031; \$0.033 effective July 1, 2009] \$0.033; \$0.040 (eff. 7/01/10) per gallon for each gallon in excess of the first one thousand (1,000) gallons.

3. This user charge system is in accordance with CFR Section 35.2140 (February 17, 1984) which is incorporated herein by this reference. (Refer to Section 12.03.010 (9), Definitions.)
