Subject Title: Action to name the new urban fishing pond located at the Carson City Fairgrounds/Fuji Park the Baily Fishing Pond. (Roger Moellendorf)

Staff Summary: On November 9, 2010, the Parks and Recreation Commission voted unanimously to name the urban fishing pond located at the Carson City Fairgrounds/Fuji Park the Baily Fishing Pond. As a result of the Commission's action, our department is forwarding the Parks and Recreation Commission's recommendation to the Board of Supervisors for consideration and approval.

Recommended Board Action: I move to name the new urban fishing pond located at the Carson City Fairgrounds/Fuji Park the Baily Fishing Pond.

Explanation for Recommended Board Action:

After construction began on the urban fishing pond project in late 2009, our department started to receive a number of inquires from the public regarding the possible naming of the urban fishing pond. In anticipation of the pond's opening, the City issued a press release on September 2, 2010, notifying the public that Carson City was receiving proposals for naming of the new urban fishing pond. Originally, 15 nominations were submitted for consideration. On November 9, 2010, the Parks and Recreation Commission voted unanimously to name the pond Baily Fishing Pond.

If the Board of Supervisors approves the recommendation from the Parks and Recreation Commission, the pond would be named after Kevin "CK" Baily. Mr. Baily has been a long time advocate for the urban fishing pond project. In addition, he has assisted our department in various grant presentations and has personally raised \$24,600 in private donations for pond construction and maintenance activities.

Currently, the pond is called the Fuji Park Pond in the Nevada Department of Wildlife's (NDOW) state fishing regulations. If the Board of Supervisors takes action to name the pond the Baily Fishing Pond, this information will be forwarded to NDOW. After that, NDOW staff will make a request to the Nevada Board of Wildlife Commission to change the pond's name in the state fishing regulations to reflect the City's official name for the pond.



4B. ACTION TO RECOMMEND TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS A NAME FOR THE URBAN FISHING POND LOCATED AT FUJI PARK. (950) – Chairperson Curtis introduced the item and Mr. Krahn read the staff report, incorporated into the record, pertaining to this agenda item. He said that 15 nominations were received with three duplications in the form of two nominations each for Baily Pond, Baily's Pond, and Eagle Valley Pond. Ten other names were submitted, however, one was later withdrawn, according to Mr. Krahn. Vice Chairperson Lasco asked for clarification of Resolution 1988 R-59, which he interpreted as limiting the board to choose from the provided list. While the legal team researched the question, Chairperson Curtis invited the commissioners and the public to comment on the nominations. Commissioner Lehmann cited a letter from the Ormsby Sportsmen's Association who withdrew their nomination, and requested that the pond not be named after an individual, living or deceased, and nominated Eagle Valley Pond. He also said he liked the name Liberty Pond, because it opened on September 11. Commissioner Brod suggested Eagle Valley Pond, after reading the resolution which suggested topographical names. Mr. Krahn clarified that the resolution did not exclude individuals, and read: "Names submitted for individuals, should be for those who contributed greatly to the community, or appropriate to the function of the facility to be named". Mr. Munn explained that "this resolution doesn't grant the Commission permission to deviate from the names that have been submitted." Mr. Munn suggested another solicitation from the community, if the submitted names were not acceptable to the Commission. Richard Dunn, who had submitted the name "Ralphie's Pond" said he suggested it, because he believed many Ralphies could be stocked in the pond, and most people would return in search of trophies. Vice Chairperson Lasco explained that Fuji Park was named after a person, and since four nominations reflected the name Baily or Baily's, he was in support of Mr. Baily's contributions, dedication, and donations, solicited or contributed. Commissioner Westergard opined that he was not "in any big hurry to name it anything until it takes on its own character, and people call it what they want". Mr. Krahn stated that in the Nevada Department of Wildlife's (NDOW) regulations, the pond had been named Fuji Park Pond. He added that now was the time that coincided with NDOW's opportunity to change regulations, if the Commission wanted to change the name. Another issue, according to Mr. Krahn, was that signage to reach the pond had to be developed. Commissioner Smolinski contemplated what would happen now that the public input had been solicited, and a timeframe was set for a Board of Supervisors decision. Mr. Munn advised that the Board of Supervisors could vote on a name from the nomination list, if the Commission decided not to choose a name. Commissioner Lehmann suggested using the term "fishing pond" in the name would be more descriptive. **Vice Chairperson Lasco moved to recommend to the Board of Supervisors that the name for the urban fishing pond located at Fuji Park be Baily Fishing Pond. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Smolenski. The motion passed 7-0.**

REQUEST: Action to recommend to the Board of Supervisors a name for the Urban Fishing Pond located at Fuji Park.

GENERAL DISCUSSION:

On September 2, 2010, the Parks and Recreation Department issued a press release notifying the public that Carson City was receiving proposals for the naming of the new urban fishing pond at Fuji Park (Exhibit A). The deadline set by our department for receiving proposals was 5:00 P.M. on Friday, September 24. As a result of this outreach, our department is pleased to inform the Commission that originally 13 names were submitted for this honor (Exhibit B). They are listed in alphabetical order:

Baily Pond (2 Nominations)	Ralphie's Pond

*** On October 19, 2010, an Ormsby Sportsmen's Association representative hand delivered to our department a letter withdrawing Richard "Dick" Biggs name from consideration as a name for the urban fishing pond. In addition, the letter supported naming the pond "The Eagle Valley Fishing Pond." (Exhibit C) ***

In order to assist the Commission with the responsibility of naming the pond, City staff has attached the Board of Supervisors' Resolution Number 1988-R-59 which established the policies and procedures for naming Parks and Recreation facilities within Carson City (Exhibit D). In addition, our department has provided the Commission with a facility master list of previously submitted facility names for review, as required by the above-referenced resolution (Exhibit E).

After the Commission takes action to name the urban fishing pond, our department will forward that recommendation to the Board of Supervisors for their consideration. City staff will request the Board of Supervisors to take action on either December 2 or December 16, 2010.

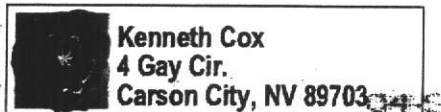


Dear Sir,

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING POLICIES AND PROCEDURES
FOR THE NAMING OF PARKS AND RECREATION FACILITIES
WITHIN CARSON CITY.

WHEREAS, Carson City Charter Provision 2.230 empowers the Board of Supervisors to regulate parks and public buildings and grounds within the City; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to establish policies and procedures for the naming of the parks and recreation facilities within Carson City.

NOW, THEREFORE, this Board hereby resolves to adopt the following:

POLICIES

1. Names, if possible, should have geographic, topographic, historical, or individual significance, generally recognized and known throughout the area.
2. Where consideration for naming involves geographical, topographical, or historical connotations, the Director of Parks and Recreation should solicit help from historical societies, subdividers, or other groups having knowledge of the area.
3. Names submitted for individuals (living or dead), should be those who have contributed greatly to the community or appropriate to the function of the facility to be named.
4. A part of the selection process may include, where desirable, a contest or competition involving the entire City in order to obtain suggestions for names to stimulate public interest.
5. Priority should be given to those names which have been unrecognized previously.
6. Individuals and organizations, etc., should be encouraged to forward proposed names to the Department of Parks and

future consideration.

PROCEDURES

1. It will be the responsibility of the City Manager to direct the Parks and Recreation Department to solicit names as soon as the City has acquired title to the property or funds approved by the Board of Supervisors for financing the project.
2. To avoid duplication and impropriety, all proposed names must be submitted in writing to the Department of Parks and Recreation who will be responsible to keep a current master list of names submitted.
3. When a specific facility is being considered for naming, publicity to this effect will be distributed by the Parks and Recreation Department and in these cases, deadline dates will be set and adhered to. All names submitted will then become a permanent part of the master list.
4. In order for a name to be considered by the Park and Recreation Commission, a detailed resume and justification must be submitted in writing to the Commission in care of the Parks and Recreation Department.
5. Once the resume has been received by the Parks and Recreation Department, their staff shall review and research the name and forward such data to the Parks and Recreation Commission for their recommendation to the Board of Supervisors.
