RE: Discussion and Action on Potential Offer to the State of Nevada Regarding

Assumption of Various Services and Re-Establishment of the 8 Cent Long-Term

Care Cap.

As you are aware, the State of Nevada is contemplating shifting services and/or costs to the counties. According to information I received from the State, these shifts amount to nearly \$7 million per year to our four counties or nearly \$14 million over the biennium. A breakdown by county is as follows:

Known Annual Impact of State Budget Shifts Proposed in the Governor's Budget:

If the four counties had to assume these costs or services, it would require additional layoffs and service reductions at a time when our counties have reduced their budgets by up to 25% already.

Over the past several months, our Legislative Coalition (made up of Carson City, Douglas County, Lyon County and Storey County) has studied the State's budget and its impact on our counties and reviewed various alternatives. The Coalition is recommending the Boards of the 4 counties consider offering to assume certain services from the State of Nevada by providing the services on a regional basis. The primary reason is we do not believe paying the State a sum of money for services without any control over the costs of the service, level of service or quality of service is in the best interests of the counties or its citizens.

In addition, the Coalition believes we have an obligation to try to help the State of Nevada during this time of need. The State is our partner. Our region is home to the State of Nevada through Carson City being the Capital City and our neighboring counties being home to many State employees. Therefore, we believe we have responsibilities not just to our citizens but to the State of Nevada.

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The following proposal constitutes a way to balance between these responsibilities by stepping forward to assist the State while not abandoning our fiscal responsibilities to provide local government services to our citizens. The proposal includes a phase-in of taking over the State services on a regional basis through the Carson City Health Department through an Interlocal Agreement between the 4 counties. These services would include Emergency Medical Services, Medical Care Related to TB, Medical Care Related to STD, Consumer/Environmental Health and Community Health. The taking over these services would be implemented over the next 18 months.

In addition, it is recommended the 4 counties continue to pay the 2.5 Cent IAF/SUP Fund to the State and to increase our Long-Term Care 50/50 Match Program payments to the State up to the current 8 cent ad valorem tax cap. The 8 cent cap will insure the Long-Term Care costs are paid from the designated Indigent Tax Fund and not from the General Fund.

Attached is a breakdown of the proposal by service by fiscal impact to each county using the State's costs. The total costs to our counties amount to \$3.5 million per year which is a substantial commitment from our 4 rural counties. It's important to note our counties' staff will have to provide a more refined cost of the service at the local level. This information will be provided to the Boards prior to the public hearing.

It is also recommended that the counties request the State provide our counties the flexibility to choose to take over State services or to pay the State for the services and to also give the counties the flexibility of revenue generation in order to pay for these services shifted to the counties. It would be up to each county to determine whether they would choose to implement any additional revenues. In addition, it is recommended the counties do not pay for or take over the other services delineated in the Governor's budget or through Legislative action simply due to the fact those additional costs will virtually break our counties. A \$3.5 million per year commitment is a tremendous cost for our counties to bear at a time when we are cutting services and staff, however, we believe this is the right thing to do.

A recommended motion would be: I move to approve the Proposed Phase-In for Assumption of State Services for the Biennium.
