This report will provide an overview of the strategic objectives and associated performance measures included in the Carson City Strategic Plan. Performance measure data is for the quarter and fiscal year ending June 30, 2011. Each chapter in the report represents a Quality of Life Perspective; each page represents a strategic objective set forth by the Board of Supervisors.

As part of this Business Review, staff has provided further explanation for those areas in which targets were not met. It is important to note that the scorecard, with its indications of whether or not performance measures met anticipated or targeted levels, is not a report card with a pass/fail connotation. Knowing where normal results are not occurring allows staff to determine possible emerging issues and develop a pro active response to those issues.

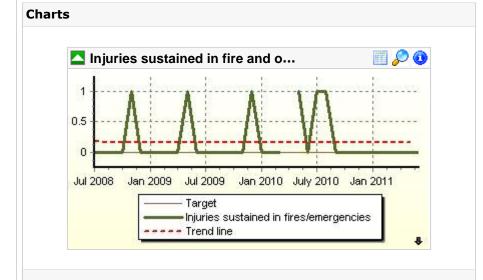

The status of capital projects as of March, 2011 is included in this report. Due to a change in staffing in the Public Works Department, more recent updates have not been received. All projects are grouped according to the various strategic plan perspectives they support.

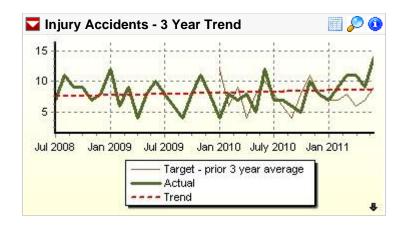

Total traffic accidents are down almost 9% from the average reported over the prior 3 years. However, accidents that resulted in injury are up almost 17% for the year, or a total of 15 accidents. Examining the quarter-to-date data, injury accidents were reported at 12 higher than the 3 year average. Thus, the increase in injury accidents has occurred principally in the second quarter of calendar 2011. The chart on the following page reflects this fact.

OPTIONS/CONSIDERATIONS: This measure must be a **Furlong, Kenny** continuously monitored as a priority for aggressive actions if the trend continues to grow. Budgetary limits have certainly reduced the manhours committed to enforcement, but this is not the cause of the accidents. However, it is noteworthy that this trend began to emerge shortly after assignment realignments were implemented due to staffing reductions in FY2011. The reported level of injury accidents has not been this high since the mid 2000's.

While overall traffic accidents remain on a general **Furlong, Kenny** decline, accidents involving "reported" injuries is beginning to show a growing trend of taking on a greater proportion of the overall total. The Sheriff's Administration is addressing this early indicator.

> DISCUSSION/ASSUMPTION: "The greater the speed, both highway and residential, the more likely the accident will result in injuries." The most significant early indicator or a problem began in the late summer of 2010. Since then, there is a clear signal that injury accidents are taking on a greater proportion (trend) of the overall number of accidents.

Residential environment accidents have been pointed out in previous reports.

There have been no significant changes to traffic flow patterns in the community during the last 12 months.

Staffing adjustments to budget reductions resulted in the lowering of traffic enforcement priorities.

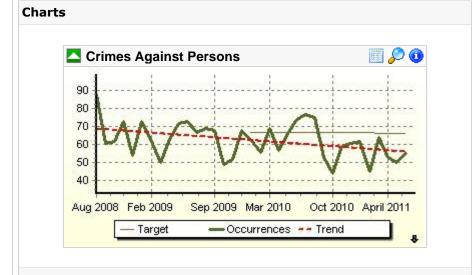
Traffic Enforcement is relatively consistent for 2009 thru 2011. In FY2011 there were approximately 3,459 violations issued (down 7% from 2009) and 1,967 stops that resulted in warnings only (up 11% from 2009). Notably, a single "ticket" can have multiple violations listed.

Targeted enforcement through increased communications with Public Works/Streets has increased and public notices (press releases) of danger zones has been added.

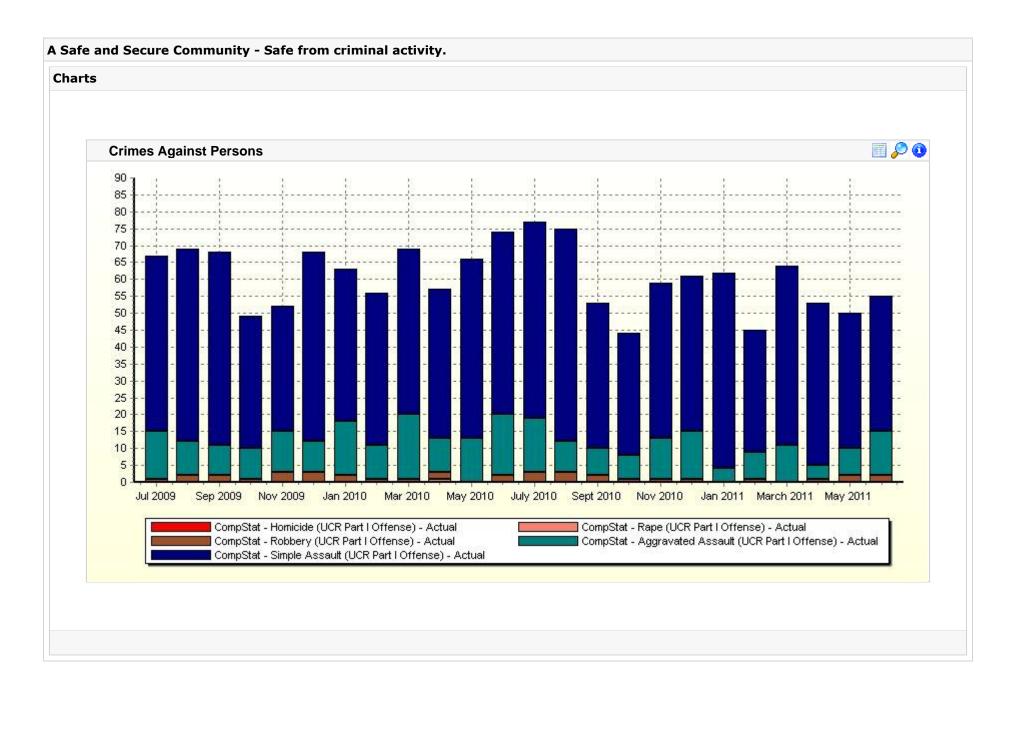

The number of offenses collected for this measure are considered initial reporting "raw data" and have not been analyzed for final reporting. The target for this measure has been set at the monthly average occurrence rate for the previous 36 months.

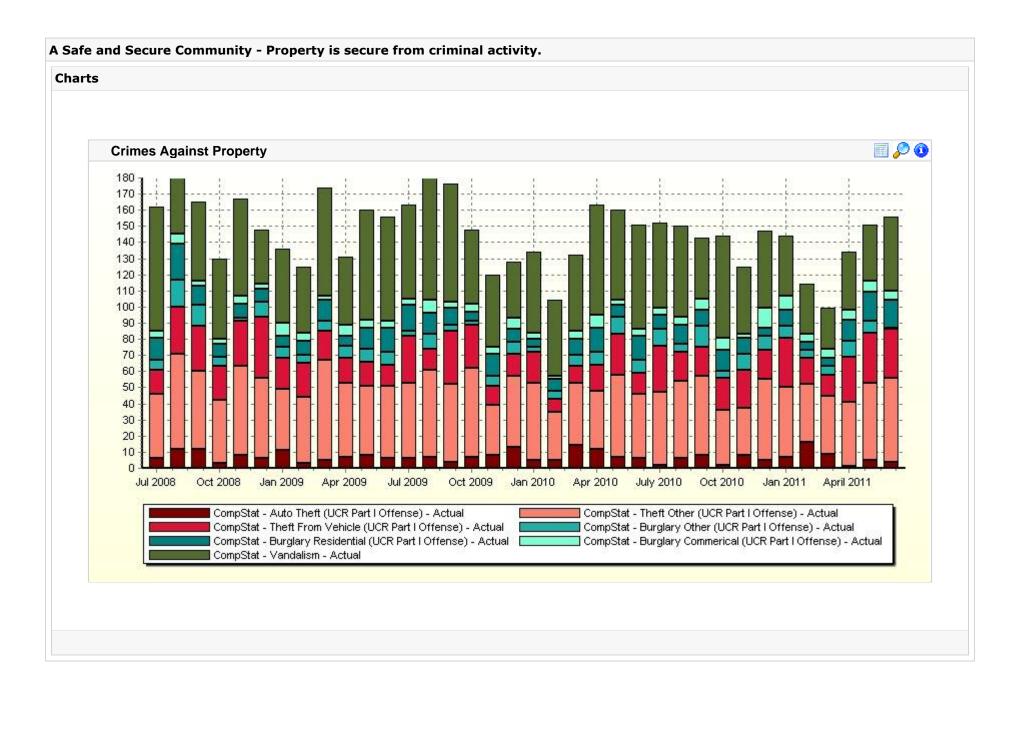

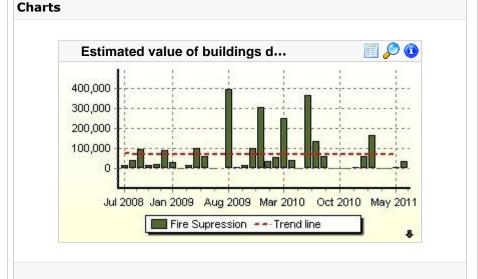
Crimes Against Property calculates the number of **Furlong, Kenny** reported crimes in the community that are categorized in Uniform Crime Reporting as "index crimes" and used to report community crime rates. For this reporting, the offenses include Burglary (commercial, residential, and other), Theft (auto, from vehicle, and other), and arson. The number of offenses collected for this measure are considered initial reporting "raw data" and have not been analyzed for final reporting. Vandalism is not an index crime, however, it is included in this report. The target for this measure is the monthly average occurrence rates for the previous 36 months.

The target set for Fire Emergency Response Times is based upon the average response time reported over the prior 3 years. The target does not reflect National Fire Protection Association recommendations.

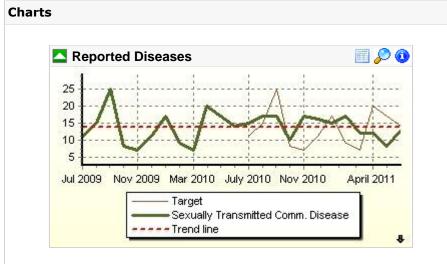
The target set for dispatched fire calls is 5% above the number of dispatched call recorded during the prior year. When calls for service rise above that level, adequate response resources could become stretched.

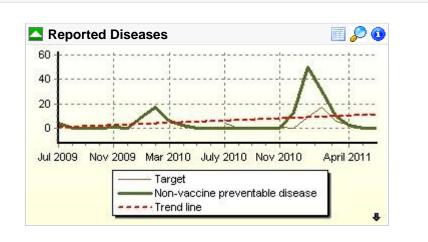

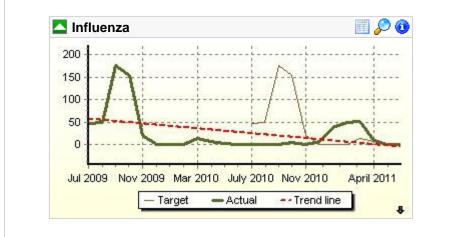

Although reported sexually transmitted communicable disease had increased during FY 2011 over FY 2010, the last quarter of FY 2011 shows a trending down. Reported Chlalmydia occurrences represent over 95% of the diseases reported.

The increase in non-vaccine preventable disease over one year ago is due to respiratory syncytial (sin-SISHuhl) virus, or RSV, a respiratory virus that infects the lungs and breathing passages. Most otherwise healthy people recover from RSV infection in 1 to 2 weeks.

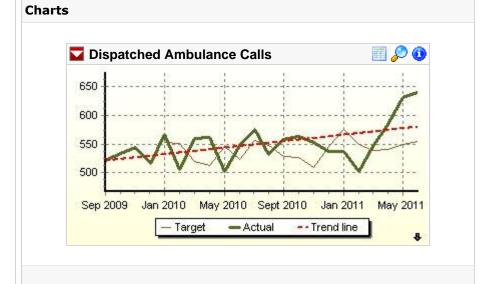

The target for dispatched ambulance calls is 5% above the average number of calls for service received during the prior 3 years. It's important to note that the increase during the fiscal year was caused by the increase experienced in the quarter ending June 30. Staff has reviewed the call data and has not been able to identify the cause for this 15% increase over the prior year.

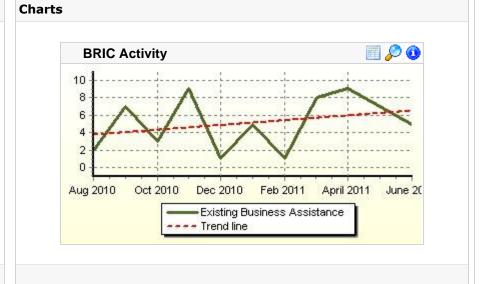
The target for business closings is to see fewer businesses close than the prior year. When comparing year-to-date data, a total of 618 businesses were reported as being closed while 576 businesses started up.

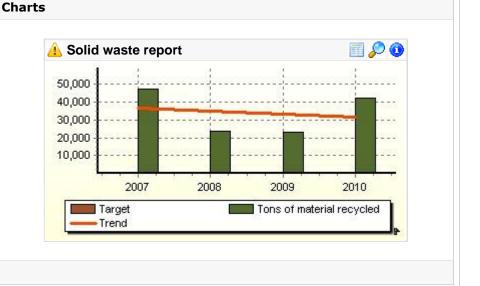

Employment numbers are gathered by Carson City employers by the State of Nevada Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation. Unemployment data is developed through a sampling of surveys of Carson City residents. Only those persons available to work but not working at the time of the survey are included. Those persons that are not searching for employment, or those that are "underemployed" are not included in these figures. For the FY ending June 30, 2011, employment dropped while at the same time, the number reported as unemployed dropped as well. It may be assumed that persons are not searching for employment any longer.

The data shown in these charts reflect totals for calendar 2010. Recycled material is calculated each year as a percentage of total solid waste generated in Carson City. This material also includes waste not delivered to the Carson City Landfill but recycled commercially. These amounts are reported directly to the State. Staff notes that the numbers for 2010 reported to the State are too high. Although the recycled percentage has been reported at 60%, it is more likely that the correct number is about 25%. The State of Nevada recommends that municipalities recycle at least 25% of their solid waste. In terms of levels of recycling, national and even global markets for recycled materials have a direct impact upon the amount of materials recycled each year. Thus, fluctuations can occur from year to year. The greatest percentage of recycled materials can be attributable to commercial recycling where materials are picked up where they are generated, never reaching the landfill.
