RE: Proposed revisions to the Carson City Scorecard

In the spring of 2009, you approved a new reporting and accountability method for Carson City government. This method focuses attention on those things most important to the community, aligns efforts throughout the City to achieve results, measures those results using data, and improves results by identifying and monitoring initiatives. The tool that manages this effort is the Carson City Scorecard. The Scorecard allows the reader to see, at a glance, what is important and which areas are producing expected results.

During this year's strategic planning workshop, staff previewed a revised scorecard. This revision does not change any of the Quality of Life Perspectives, but consolidates some of the objectives and measures. The result is streamlined tool that provides indications of top level results.
