
"Open space is undeveloped land having significant natural resources important to the quality of life in our community"


Ballot Question #18




#### Carson River Canyon former Serpa & Bently acquisitions environmental significance

    - Carson River Project: "More than 200 bird species can be found throughout the Carson River watershed, making it one of the richest bird sites in the entire state of Nevada"





