Subject Title: For possible action to authorize the Mayor or his designee to sign a letter directed to the Southern Nevada Public Land Management Act - Parks, Trails and Natural Areas program in support of Carson City's grant request recommended for Round 13. (Juan F. Guzman)

Staff Summary: The Bureau of Land Management has called for a 45-day written comments period on the Round 13 preliminary recommendations for nominated projects for the Southern Nevada Public Land Management Act grants. Carson City's nominated project, the Carson River trail system - Eagle Valley Creek segment, under the Parks, Trails and Natural Areas category has been preliminarily ranked second. The dollar amount of the requested grant is for \$264,700. It is important to submit letters of support since the preliminary recommendation will be the subject of subsequent reviews by the Executive Committee and finally the Secretary of the Interior.

On behalf of the Carson City Board of Supervisors and our residents, please accept this letter in support of Carson City's project nomination for Round 13 of the Southern Nevada Public Land Management Act - Parks, Trails and Natural Areas category for the design and construction of the "Eagle Valley Creek trail segment." This project is located in the vicinity of the Carson River between the Empire Ranch Trail and the Riverview Park trail in Carson City, Nevada.

The proposed project, which has an estimated cost of \$264,700, calls for the design and installation of two prefabricated bridges to cross Eagle Valley Creek and approximately 300 linear feet of decomposed granite trail that will link existing miles of trails to the north and to the south. The improvements will be specifically designed to cross Eagle Valley Creek and to comply with floodway regulations. The facilities are proposed in the heart of an existing natural park area that has been developed in Carson City through the purchase of properties including the Bently acquisition project (CR-1), a fee title purchase that was facilitated by a prior grant through the Parks, Trails and Natural Areas category in Round 11. To the south of the site where the crossing is proposed lies Riverview Park, one of our most used parks which contains a complex of trails and provides passive recreation improvements adjacent to the river. Once this trail connection is completed, a hiker, bicyclist, or equestrian user near downtown Carson City will be able to access the river area approximately 4 miles west of Carson City through a network of off-road non-motorized multi-purpose trails.

I anticipate that the Executive Committee will share the enthusiasm that our residents show for this project and will forward the Secretary of the Interior a recommendation to fully fund this proposal.
