

BLM Seeks Input on the Carson Valley Discovery Trail

The Bureau of Land Management (BLM), Sierra Front Field Office in Carson City, Nevada has been coordinating the development of the Carson Valley Discovery Trail since 2007. The Carson Valley Trails Association (CVTA) is a community-based organization focused on providing non-motorized recreation opportunities for the general public. The Project area is located in Douglas and Carson City Counties.

In order to fulfill the requirements of the National Environmental Policy Act and National Historic Preservation Act, an EA to evaluate the potential effects of trail construction and maintenance will be prepared by the BLM.

In preparing their proposal, the CVTA has provided the BLM with the following information:

- Construct and maintain 45 miles of new non-motorized trails along the westside of the Pine Nut Mountains;
- The trail system would include one primary trail with five loop trails;
- The new trails would involve BLM-managed lands and a small portion of lands managed by the Humboldt-Toiyabe National Forest (and is participating as a Cooperating Agency);
- Utilize two existing trailhead/access points for parking and trail information;
- Modify or construct eight new trailhead/access points for parking and trail information;

- Installation of directional and educational signage.

To assist the BLM in evaluating the CVTA's proposal and whether there are existing concerns or conflict of uses for the Carson Valley Discovery Trail project, your input is requested at this early stage.

- Do you have knowledge of sensitive or unique resources within the proposed project area?
- Do you have knowledge of conflicts between recreation users within the proposed project area?
- Do you have knowledge of conflicts with the proposed trailhead/access points?
- Do you have other information about the proposed project area that could assist us with our evaluation?

The draft EA for this proposal would be made available for a 30-day public review and comment period in the summer of 2013.

Preliminary Identification of Resource Issues

Biological Resources

• A portion of the project area is adjacent to occupied habitat for the Carson wandering skipper (*Pseudocopaeodes eunus obscurus*), an endangered species. Informal consultation under the Endangered Species Act may be required for a short section of the trail adjacent to the occupied habitat.

- The project area is not within Bi-state sage-grouse (Centrocercus urophasianus) priority habitat, a BLM Sensitive Species and candidate species for listing on the Endangered Species Act. The project area is 8.5 miles northwest of two leks near the Burbank Canyon Wilderness Study Area and 17.8 miles southwest of multiple leks located on the eastside of the Pine Nut Mountains. Their status (historic, active, not active) is unknown. Bi-state sage-grouse are not known to occupy areas in the immediate vicinity of the project.
- Golden eagle (Aquila chrysaetos) nests and Swainson's hawk (Buteo swainsoni) nests are located outside of the project area, and are at least 2.5 miles west of the project area. Their status (historic, active, not active) is unknown.
- A botanical inventory for portions of the trail system with a high likelyhood of BLM sensitive plants would be conducted in April 2013.

Cultural Resources

 A class III cultural resources inventory would be conducted on BLM and USFS lands during October/November 2012. Based on this inventory, the trail corridor may be modified to take into account the presence of historic properties.
