It reflects persons that are living in their home or assisted living receiving Medicald Services including CHIPS as well as Supported Living Arrangements for adults with developmental disabilities. 142-155.9% FBR income guideline. 
Workforce Program and Jobs

In April we surveyed the employers that attended the job fair in February and found that from the 619 jobseekers that went to the job fair 43 were employed, that is 14% of the jobseekers. These numbers are not reflected in these graphs because our Workforce Program operates under the CSBG grant and not all the jobseekers that attend the job fairs are screen for income and residency eligibility as defined by the grant. Holding the job fairs allows our program to do some networking with employers and the ability to recruit eligible clients to our services.

Our second job fair is June 14 and again we will delay surveying the 50 employers to give them time to recruit and interview potential employers.




In 2010 we received 39 consumer complaints against permittic food establishments. Of those 39 complaints, 56 percent wer confirmed when staff conducted onsite visits.

In 2011 we received 16 consumer complaints against permittire food establishments. Of those 16 complaints only 25 percent were confirmed when staff conducted onsite visits.

In 2012 we received 25 consumer complaints against permitte food establishments. Of those 25 complaints, 48 percent wer confirmed when staff conducted onsite visits.

The chart on the right provides a breakdown by year on the type of complaint reported by the consumer to our office.

Permitted Food Establishment Carson City, NV Complaint Type 2010-2012















This chart reflects the number of Chlymdida/Gonomea, Syphilis, and Hepatitis C tests performed at that the Health Department Clinic as well as outreach testing at the Carson City Juvenile Detention Center.

In 2012 there was a decrease in our Chlymdida age adjusted rate per 100,000, whereas the State of Nevada and the Nation experienced and increase from the previous year.





Clinical Services and Chronic Disease Prevention has been collaborating throughout 2013 to bring STD education to our local high school students. Thus far in 2013, 678 students have received STD education from Health Department Staff.








Hepatitis A Outbreak Response

On May 31, 2013 CCHHS in collaboration with the Nevada State Health Division istuded a press retease in regards to the concern that consuming a product sold at a netionwide warehouse has been linked to an Outbreak of hapatitis A. In response to this autbreak CCHHS established a local not line for discers to cell to ask questions about the outbreak and we published FAQ's and links to information on the outbreak on our reabilities.

As of noon on Thursday June 6, 2013, we have not had any confirmed cases in Cerson City. Our hot line has fielded 46 calls addressing the concerns of 56 oitizens who had questions about being exposed to the receiled product. Since the issuance of the prices release, we have provided post exposure prophylexis to 27 individuals in our community.
