





These charts show the adoptions for cats and Dogs.


Total Adopted Cats so far for 2013: 52


Total Adopted Dogs so far for 2013: 138

Year to date, the Clinical Services Division has exceeded it's service provision projections by close to 1100 (1072).


Throughout the past quarter we were preparing for Back to School and the increased demand for well child exams and immunization services. We expanded our typical weekly immunization clinic to daily vaccinations for the two weeks prior to the first day of school. We advertised on Facebook, in the Nevada Appeal, and the JAC Bus. We also coordinated promotional flyer distribution with school nurses and school administrative staff responsible for registration. As a result we saw close to 400 individuals and provided 845 immunizations in order to protect our community from vaccine preventable diseases.




Air Quality Response

- The Rim Fire began on August 17, 2013
- August 22 a notable shift in the areas' air quality was becoming apparent
- NDEP had issued a press release regarding local air quality.
- August 23 We then began monitoring air quality reports, gathering information to advise our future action steps, and were in communication with the Nevada State Health Division's Public Health Preparedness Program, as well as the Washoe County Health Department
- August 26-CCHHS action plan was developed
- August 28, we addressed the poor air quality and interventions in our weekly Nevada Appeal article
- August 26-Sept 3, we distributed masks along with the community educational materials that we developed

Accreditation



The Accreditation Team has many subcommittees

that are hard at work on various projects. A couple of these subcommittees include the Workforce Development Committee and the Performance Management Team.

The Workforce Development Committee has nearly completed a core competency self-assessment survey to distribute to employees. The purpose of this survey is to uncover any areas within their core competencies where employees may feel that they could use training or extra guidance to perform their duties to the best of their ability. The survey will be de-identified and distributed via Survey Monkey so that employees of each grouping (Management, program, and administrative staff) can feel comfortable giving their honest answers.

The Performance Management Team has been busy building an organization-wide Performance Management and Quality Improvement system. There are already a very large amount of informal Quality Improvement projects at CCHHS on an ongoing basis, but this system will allow staff to fully understand the Quality Improvement process, thus allowing for stronger projects and better results.

The Marketing Team is a pseudo-subcommittee of the Accreditation Team, and is largely composed of staff that is not directly on the Accreditation Team itself, although there are representatives. The Marketing Team is involved in many projects, but specific to PHAB, there are templates and marketing plans being developed to best brand and market our services to population subgroups specified by our grants, while maintaining a high level of continuity and quality among all marketing materials.
