For Possible Action: To recommend to the Board of Supervisors to support the Western Nevada Youth Foundation's effort to fund the installation of a universally accessible/sensory playground and to

designate a site for the project in Mills Park.

GENERAL DISCUSSION:

Over the past few months, Parks and Recreation Department staff has been working with Everybody Plays advocates (Refer to Exhibit A) to identify a location for a universally accessible/sensory playground in Mills Park. These advocates are associated with the Western Nevada Youth Foundation (WNYF), 501 C 3 organization (Refer to Exhibit B). The location beginning considered for this project is an area east of the existing tennis courts, west of Mills Park Lane (park entrance off of Palo Verde Drive), and south of the existing creek. Everybody Plays advocates will be at this meeting to present their ideas and project scope for this universally accessible/sensory playground project (Refer to Exhibit C).

Also, they will be discussing their upcoming fund raising events, ideas for community partnerships with the builders within the community, and their desire to apply for grants to complete the project (Refer to Exhibit D). Parks and Recreation Department staff is in support of this project and its location in Mills Park. Both City staff and the advocates are seeking a recommendation from the Parks and Recreation Commission to take to the Board of Supervisors a request to dedicate this area for their project. If the advocates can raise the funds and get the necessary in-kind labor commitment from the builders within the community, they will return at a later date with a detailed playground design and phasing plan for the Commission to approve.

Staff does not want an open ended City commitment to reserve this area of the park indefinitely for this project. The advocates understand staff's reasoning and agree with this project constraint. They are very motivated to begin playground construction in the next few years. As a result, staff is recommending the Commission add the following language to the below motion:

"and reserve this area of the park for the next five years with the option for yearly administrative extensions after that date by the Parks and Recreation Director".

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

I move to recommend to the Board of Supervisors to support the Western Nevada Youth Foundation's effort to fund the installation of a universally accessible/sensory playground, designate a site for the project in Mills Park, and reserve this area of the park for the next five years with the option for yearly administrative extensions after that date by the Parks and Recreation Director.

Dear Applicant:

Based on information you supplied, and assuming your operations will be as stated in your application for recognition of exemption, we have determined you are exempt from federal income tax under section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code as an organization described in section 501(c)(3). We also determined that you are a private foundation within the meaning of section 509(a) of the Code.

Based on the information you submitted with your application, we have determined that you are likely to qualify as a private operating foundation described in section 4942(j)(3) of the Code. Accordingly, you are treated as a private operating foundation for your first year of exempt status. After that, you will be treated as a private operating foundation as long as you continue to meet the requirements of section 4942(j)(3).

If you change your sources of support, your purposes, character, or method of operation, please let us know so we can consider the effect of the change on your exempt status and foundation status. If you amend your organizational document or bylaws, please send us a copy of the amended document or bylaws. Also, let us know any changes in your name or address.

As of January 1, 1984, you are liable for social security taxes under the Federal Insurance Contributions Act on amounts of \$100 or more you pay to each of your employees during a calendar year. You are not liable for the tax imposed under the Federal Unemployment Tax Act (FUTA). However, since you are a private foundation, you are subject to excise taxes under Chapter 42 of the Code. You also may be subject to other Federal excise taxes. If you have any questions about excise, employment, or other Federal taxes, please let us know.

Donors may deduct contributions to you as provided in section 170 of the Code. Bequests, legacies, devises, transfers, or gifts to you or for your use are deductible for federal estate and gift tax purposes if they meet the applicable provisions of sections 2055, 2106, and 2522 of the Code.

Donors may deduct contributions only to the extent their contributions are gifts, with no consideration received. Ticket purchases and similar payments in conjunction with fundraising events may not necessarily qualify as deductible contributions, depending on the circumstances. See Publication 1391, which sets forth guidelines on when payments made by taxpayers for admission

to, or other participation in fundraising activities for charity are deductible as charitable contributions.

You are required to file Form 990-PF. Return of Private Foundation or Section 4947(a)(1) Trust Treated as a Private Foundation. Form 990-PF must be filed by the 15th day of the fifth month after the end of your annual accounting period. A penalty of \$10 a day is charged when a return is filed late, unless there is reasonable cause for the delay. However, the maximum penalty charged cannot exceed \$5,000 or 5 percent of your gross receipts for the year, whichever is less. This penalty may also be charged if a return is not complete, so please be sure your return is complete before you file it.

You are not required to file federal income tax returns unless you are subject to the tax on unrelated business income under section 511 of the Code. If you are subject to this tax, you must file an income tax return on Form 990-T, Exempt Organization Business Income Tax Return. In this letter we are not determining whether any of your present or proposed activities are unrelated trade or business as defined in section 513 of the Code.

You need an employer identification number even if you have no employees. If you did not enter an employer identification number on your application, we will assign a number to you and let you know. Please use that number on all returns you file and in all correspondence with the Internal Revenue Service.

In accordance with section 508(a) of the Internal Revenue Code, the effective date of this determination letter is July 5, 1995.

This determination is based on evidence that your funds are dedicated to the purposes listed in section 501(c)(3) of the Code. To assure your continued exemption, you should keep records to show that funds are spent only for those purposes. If you distribute funds to other organizations, your records should show whether they are exempt under section 501(c)(3). In cases where the recipient organization is not exempt under section 501(c)(3), you must have evidence that the funds will remain dedicated to the required purposes and that the recipient will use the funds for those purposes.

If you distribute funds to individuals, you should keep case histories showing the recipients' names, addresses, purposes of awards, manner of selection, and relationship (if any) to members, officers, trustees or donors of funds to you, so that you can substantiate upon request by the Internal Revenue Service any and all distributions you made to individuals. (Revenue Ruling 56-304, C.B. 1956-2, page 306.)

If we have indicated in the heading of this letter that an addendum applies, the addendum enclosed is an integral part of this letter.

Because this letter could help resolve any questions about your exempt status and private foundation status, you should keep it for your records.

Manual and motorized wheel chairs often find it difficult or impossible to traverse the grassy areas surrounding playground equipment and are then faced with the added burden of sand or bark filled playgrounds.

To this end we are currently looking at an area in Mills Park to build this Dream Park. We believe that a park of this nature will not only become a focal point for the communities special needs individuals and their families to experience healthy interactions with their loved ones and peers, but also attract a larger section of Carson City's population to come and enjoy this beautiful park.


LOCATION MAP KEY

- This will be where we would like to see the main accessible play structure located. this would be surrounded by other sensory, exercise and accessible playground equipment. a mix of concrete and pour in place rubber surfaces will be utilized for accessibility and safety.
- B The existing restrooms will have to be updated to be ADA compliant
- The existing pavillion and surrounding area needs to be redesigned
- Sidewalks need to be made ADA compliant. Possibly remove portion of planter to expand handicapped parking
- Make existing park table ADA accessible
- Expand and upgrade existing parking lot
