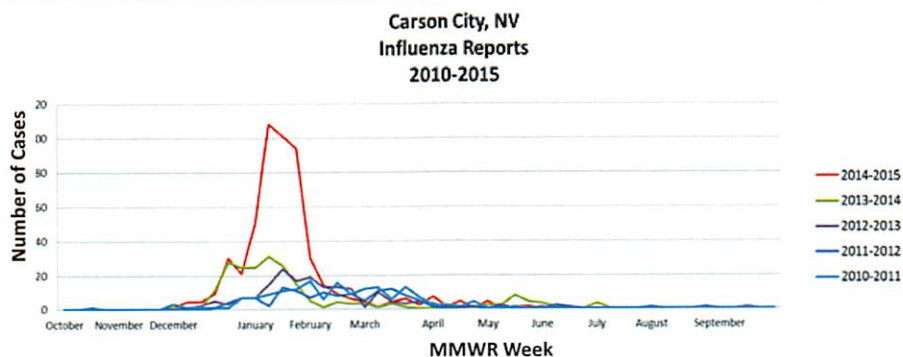

Epidemiology Program



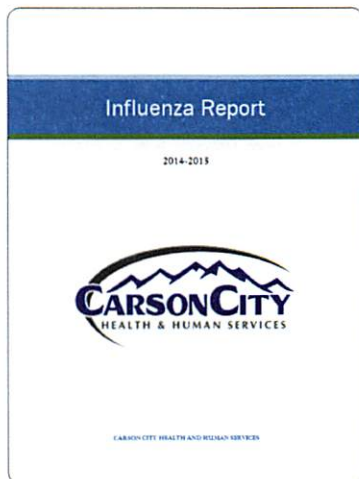
This past influenza season Carson City experienced a large increase in the number of physicians who reported influenza cases. CCHHS will be publishing the year end report which will be posted on our website.

RAM is an international organization that travels the country and throughout the world providing free medical services with no qualifications. This event is for those in Northern Nevada who are uninsured or underinsured, with no eligibility requirements and no ID necessary. Medical services are provided on a first come, first served basis. Line-up starts at Midnight, numbers given out at 3 a.m., doors open at 6 a.m.



DENTAL SERVICES

Poor dental health can affect a patient's overall health and result in serious medical problems. Essential Dental Services provided at RAM clinics include: cleanings, fillings, and extractions, and may include restorative procedures.

VISION SERVICES

For many patients a pair of glasses may allow them to drive more safely, to see or obtain a job, and/or to read a book for the first time in many years. Essential Vision Services provided at RAM clinics include: basic screenings, refracting, eye exams, and eye glasses for patients receiving a prescription.



MEDICAL SERVICES

Essential Medical Services at a RAM clinic are dependent upon local resources and can include general medical consultations, diabetic screenings and education, mammograms*, PAP smears, and other specialty services. **PATIENTS MUST BRING LIST OF CURRENT MEDICATIONS!** *Call 877-581-4266 to make an appointment to see if you qualify for a free or reduced-cost mammogram screening. Walk-in appointments also available at the RAM clinic.

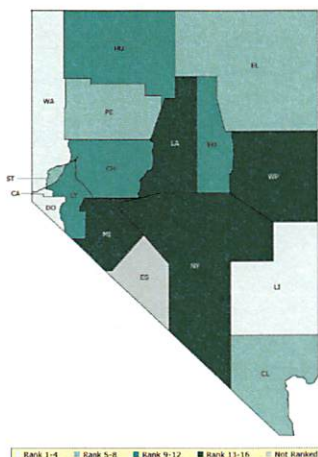

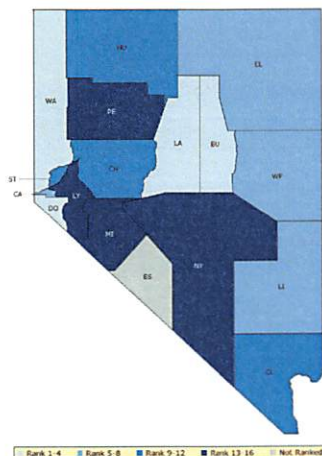
