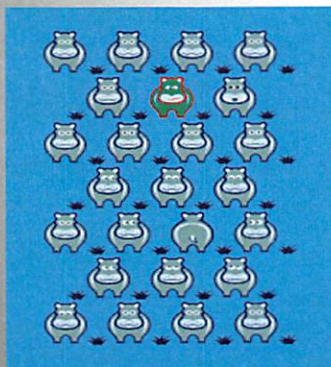
The Year of: Community Immunity

2015: Raw Data

- To date: Completed > 40 Community Events (some of those events covered multiple days)
 - ~1920 Flu vaccines ~15 Tdap ~6 Pneumonia ~4 Shingles
- RAM- Remote Area Medical Event
 - 452 Flu, 162 Tdap, 40 Pneumonia, 51 Shingles, 8 Hep's
- School Located Vaccine Program: 18 schools
3 school districts
 - over 3500 Flu vaccinations
- Organized 4 Health Fairs with Flu Clinics

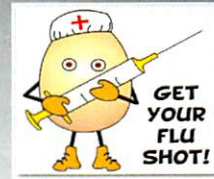
Insurance


- Private Insured: 3,739 (includes adult Medicaid)
- Medicaid: 1,112
- NO Insurance: 593

All our events collect this information and vaccine funding source is based on type of insurance information provided.



2015 Challenges Vaccines



- CCHHS Pre-books Vaccines in Feb/March
- Vaccine Delivery Delays: Ship to Schedule Dates not met
- Vaccine deliveries = Incomplete Orders 
- Emergency order of Multi-dose vials: Deal with latex and preservatives and nurses draw up vaccine
- Nasal Mist: Production delay and Distribution delays: ONLY received 210 doses of 900 ordered. Arrived after Carson City School District Completed – letters/flyers/phone calls had to be made to alert parents to NO Mist available at CCSD
- NEW TEMP LOGGER requirements: Temperatures monitored on vaccines at all off-site events with a data logger. Download to State/CDC after each event. All excursions must be documented and vaccine kept separate. Training and Learning Curve!



2015 Challenges Schools



- Decrease in Parent Volunteers impacts our resources and utilizes very lean CCHHS staffing
- Last-minute schedule change requests: This is not acceptable as we schedule schools in May
- One school required a change of date due to a teacher stating she could not be exposed to MIST and had to have 3 days off. School changed to a Friday to avoid a formal complaint with teacher union.
- Schools request to complete flu clinics in ONE week. This requires 2–3 schools be done in 1 day
- We must work within schools schedules and do not know what each day of the week looks like with “Specials” classes and Pre-K classes. Flexibility is the key on-site!!



2015 Challenges Staffing

- We run on very lean resources: No grant funding for these projects. Staff are assigned other program responsibilities in their grant projects. This is above and beyond those duties, thus they must take duties or complete after hours.
- Decrease in MRC volunteer support: Decrease involvement and clinics during work week hours.
- Training of Staff: Complexity of training of all aspects of vaccine payer sources affecting type of vaccine used.
- Lean resources to complete large task of data entry:
 1. Web IZ – State
 2. eClinical – demographics, charting, & billing;
 3. Transact RX – Medicare

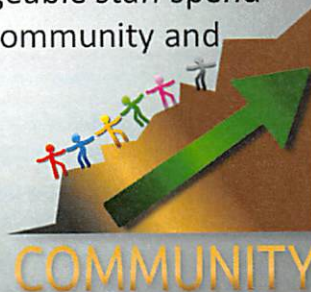
Other

- Events generate phone calls: medical, insurance, paperwork, employers, parents, will you come back?
- Private Providers now rely on CCHHS to deliver large amount of Flu vaccine coverage to community
- Requests for Events: we cannot always accommodate due to schedules or staffing

- We provide the #1 largest **Outreach** volume of immunizations in Nevada as a Health Department
- We Reach Out to Venues outside of the Department. We go where the vulnerable population resides.
- We educate: Watch our knowledgeable staff spend time teaching and educating our community and patients.
- We make referrals to our Services at CCHHS





- We provide the Quadivalent Vaccine to our Quad-County Community
- We are Multi-Jurisdictional
- Our Community expects us to be there! They expect us to say YES!
- We vaccinate 3 State of Nevada Agencies
- Many request a Health Fair component with their flu clinic
- Revenue Collected last year: ~\$239,883
