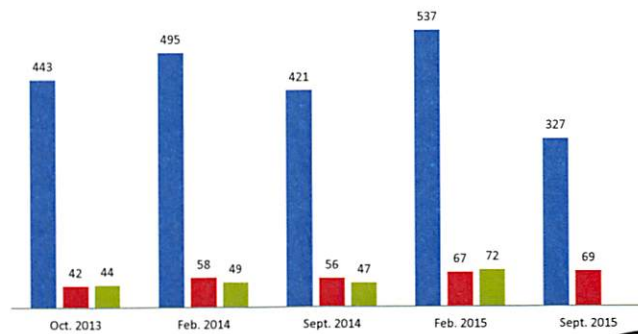

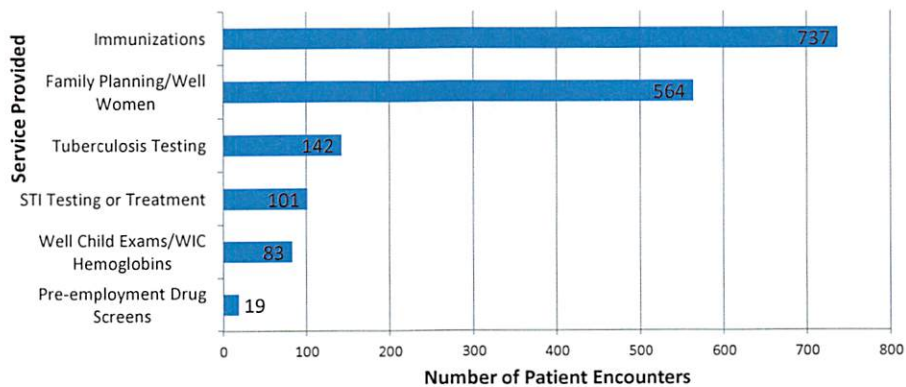

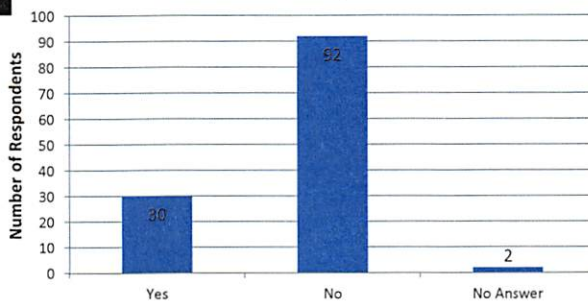

Do You Smoke Cigarettes?

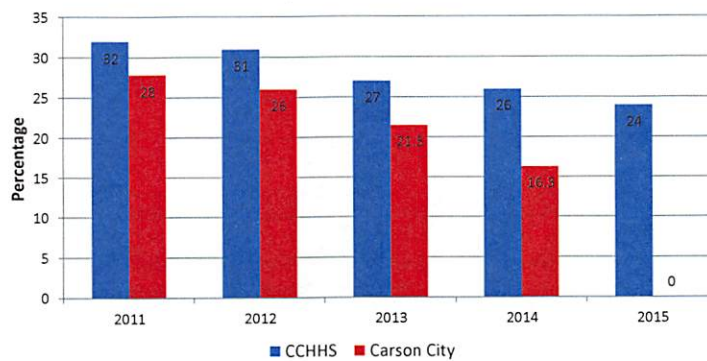

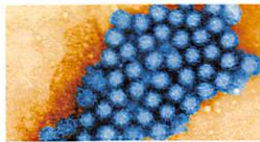
