Clinical Services

According to the CDC, Chlamydia is the most prevalent STD occurring at a rate of almost 89% of all STDs diagnosed. Eighty percent of all chlamydia cases diagnosed are in individuals 24 years of age and younger. In Carson City, young adults aged 20-24 experienced a greater than 50% increase in Chlamydia rates from 2013 to 2014.

CCHHS Clinical Services plays a vital role in STD screening in our community. Forty-five percent of all positive Chlamydia cases reported by 25 providers in the Carson City service area during 2014 were tested at CCHHS.



On Dec. 21, CCHHS was notified of two (2) laboratory confirmed cases of Salmonella. As of January 8, 2016, after administrating a questionnaire we established 14 additional individuals were ill.

Environmental Health

The Program Standards are designed to help food regulatory programs enhance the services they provide to the public. When applied in the intended manner, the Program Standards should:

- Identify program areas where an agency can have the greatest impact on retail food safety
- Promote wider application of effective risk-factor intervention strategies
- Assist in identifying program areas most in need of additional attention
- Provide information needed to justify maintenance or increase in program budgets
- Lead to innovations in program implementation and administration
- Improve industry and consumer confidence in food protection programs by enhancing uniformity within and between regulatory agencies


- Finalized Public Health Jurisdictional Risk Assessments for Carson City and Douglas County

- One Day Stand against Tobacco at WNC was great success for first time event.
- Working with Carson Tahoe Hospital on their electronic discharge instructions on Smoking Cessation.
- Sandy Wartgow will be on a state task force working on electronic discharge instructions for smoking cessation throughout the state.
- Working with Carson Medical Group on a Smoking Cessation Policy for the practice to follow. This may be the first type of this policy in the State.
- Completed survey of Multi unit housing tenants at 2 complexes regarding smoke-free policy work. Will be meeting with 1 complex to discuss moving forward with a policy to become a Smoke-free complex.
- Carson City Youth have placed cigarette disposal containers and cigarette litter signage in local parks with the Parks and Rec. Dept. They have also been active in increasing their presence in social media to send anti- tobacco messaging.
- Working on Cessation billing and new ICD 10 codes which increased from 1 code to over 50 codes.

Fiscal Update

HIV Prevention Grant – Beginning 1/1/16 – we realized a 51% reduction (\$26,879)

- Redirected portion of staff member's salary to another grant
- Adjusted the grant deliverables

In 2015, all of the grants renewed have been flat funded yet we have increases to the personnel expenses

- Clinical Services within some of the grants the extra personnel expenses are covered by revenue collected along with reducing the amount of dollars available for operating expenses or other line items within the grant award
- All other programs extra expenses are offset by reducing the amount of dollars available for operating expense funds or other lir items within the grant award
