


COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKER PILOT PROGRAM

- Feedback of diagnostic information to improve service delivery
- o Incentives to motivate providers to change immunization practices or recognition of improved or high performance
- o eXchange of information among providers.







Environmental Health

The year-long International Food Protection Training Institute (IFPTI) Fellowship program includes:

- Series of seminars conducted during three week-long sessions
- Research project with professional guidance and support from subject matter experts in research and food protection





Fellowship research project:

- Fellows are expected to design and conduct a research project about a current food protection or regulatory issue and write a journal quality paper.
- Selected papers are submitted to the Association of Food and Drug Officials (AFDO) Journal for publication
- Fellows create and deliver a PowerPoint presentation and poster on their research at the AFDO Annual Conference

- To date, 6 schools scheduled to receive bicycle safety instruction with the bike trailer this spring




