Subject Title: Action to accept a grant from the Carson Water Subconservancy District (CWSD) in the amount of \$50,000.00 to assist Carson City with the development and implementation of an Aquifer Storage and Recovery (ASR) Program.

Staff Summary: Staff recommends the acceptance of this grant to develop a sustainable, reliable, cost-effective ASR water resource management program in which water is introduced into permeable geologic formations using wells and then recovered for potable uses.

Recommended Board Action: I move to accept a grant from the Carson Water Subconservancy District (CWSD) in the amount of \$50,000.00 to assist Carson City with the development and implementation of an Aquifer Storage and Recovery (ASR) Program.

Discussion: The purpose of this program is to develop a sustainable, reliable, cost-effective ASR water resource management program in which water is introduced into permeable geologic formations using wells and then recovered for potable uses. This will be accomplished in three phases. Phase 1 includes: Feasibility Studies to define and evaluate the hydraulic, engineering, and economical feasibility of ASR in Carson City. Pilot Testing and Permitting to develop the testing plans and protocols. Monitoring and Reporting to form the basis to move the ASR program from planning and construction to operations and maintenance. Phase 2 includes: Pilot Testing Program that evaluates the response of the aquifer to injection and recovery, which must demonstrate adequate recovery efficiency and water quality. Phase 3 includes: Full-Scale Implementation that considers the scaling-up of ASR's hydraulic and water quality responses that can change with the scale of injection and recovery. The ASR Program benefits include:

- Increased utilization of Quill Treatment Plant capacity,
- Increase groundwater levels,
- Improve groundwater quality (arsenic level reduction),
- Treat and inject excess surface water from Marlette/Hobart and Ash and King's Canyon for future use,
- Reduce the amount of surface water, debris and sediment flows through Carson City to the Carson River,
- Provides an alternative means of capturing water during seasons of high availability for use during dry seasons, and
- Increasing water storage and maximizing the beneficial and efficient use of water supplies during water resource planning or drought planning processes.

INTERLOCAL CONTRACT

Addressing Funding From Subconservancy District
To Carson City for Development of the
Carson City Aquifer Storage and Recovery Program

THIS CONTRACT dated this ____ day of ______, 2006, is entered into by and between CARSON CITY, a political subdivision of the State of Nevada and the CARSON WATER SUBCONSERVANCY DISTRICT, a political subdivision of the State of Nevada (hereinafter "CWSD").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, CARSON CITY is a governmental subdivision of the State of Nevada and therefore a public agency under NRS 277.100; and

WHEREAS, CWSD is a water subconservancy district created and organized under the provisions of Chapter 541 of NRS; and

WHEREAS, this Contract is entered into under the provisions of NRS 277.180 and accordingly must be ratified by appropriate official action of the governing body of each party as a condition precedent to its entry into force; and

WHEREAS, CARSON CITY is proposing to develop the Carson City Aquifer Storage and Recovery (ASR) Program; and described in Exhibit "A", attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, CWSD has agreed to set aside \$50,000.00 for fiscal year 2006-07 beginning July 1, 2006, and to grant CARSON CITY said amount in order to assist with the projects set forth in Exhibit "A".

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and of the mutual covenants herein contained, it is mutually agreed by and between the parties as follow:

- CWSD hereby grants to CARSON CITY up to \$50,000.00 for fiscal year
 2006-07 beginning July 1, 2006, and to grant CARSON CITY said amount in order to assist with the projects set forth in Exhibit "A
- CARSON CITY will submit requests for funding periodically over the fiscal year. The request for funding shall be accompanied by a description of what the funds were used for and shall reference this Contract.
- CWSD commits to pay the approved amount of the request to CARSON
 CITY within four (4) weeks of said request.
- 4. CWSD shall have no responsibility for costs exceeding \$50,000.00.
- 5. This Contract shall terminate June 30, 2007, at which time CARSON CITY shall have one (1) month thereafter to submit its final invoice for payment related to work performed under this Contract.
- 6. The parties will not waive and intend to assert available NRS chapter 41 liability limitations in all cases. Contract liability of both parties shall not be subject to punitive damages. To the extent applicable, actual contract damages for any breach shall be limited by NRS 353.260 and NRS 354.626.
- 7. a. Consistent with paragraph 6 of this Contract, each party shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend, not excluding the others right to participate, the other party from and against all liability, claims, actions,

damages, losses, and expenses, including, but not limited to, reasonable attorneys fees and costs, arising out of any alleged negligent or willful acts or omissions of the indemnifying party, its officers, employees and agents. Such obligation shall not be construed to negate, abridge, or otherwise reduce any other right or obligation of indemnity which would otherwise exist as to any party or person described in this paragraph.

- b. The indemnification obligation under this paragraph is conditioned upon receipt of written notice by the indemnifying party within thirty (30) days of the indemnified party's accrual notice of any actual or pending claim or cause of action. The indemnifying party shall not be liable to hold harmless any attorneys' fees and costs for the indemnified party's chosen right to participate with legal counsel.

- This Contract shall be by and between the parties hereto and shall not be assignable or transferable.
- 10. Any dispute regarding this Contract shall be decided according to the laws of the State of Nevada. If any part of this Contract is declared to be unlawful, any remaining obligations shall be deemed terminated.

- This Contract may only be amended by consent of both parties. Any
 amendments must be written and executed with the same formality as this
 Contract.
- 12. This Contract constitutes the entire understanding between the parties and there are no representations, conditions, warranties or collateral agreements (expressed or implied), statutory or otherwise, with respect to the subject of this Contract.
- 13. Notwithstanding this Contract is initially executed by the CARSON CITY Manager and General Manager of CWSD, this Contract becomes effective when ratified by appropriate official action of the governing body of each party, and shall be deemed dated as of the later date of said official action.
- 14. The parties hereto represent and warrant that the person executing this Contract on behalf of each party has full power and authority to enter into this Contract and that the parties are authorized by law to engage in cooperative action set forth herein.
- 15. This Contract shall be entered into with duplicate originals, realizing that each entity, by necessity, must approve and execute the subject

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document at different dates, times and places.

PROJECT NAME: Carson City Aquifer Storage and Recovery (ASR) Program Development

PROJECT LOCATION: Carson City's west-side production well field aquifer and two of the highest arsenic impacted wells.

We're looking at a multi phased approach – <u>Phase1</u> Feasibility Studies that define and evaluate the hydrogeolic, engineering, and economical feasibility of ASR in Carson City. Pilot Test Planning and Permitting that develops the testing plans and protocols. Monitoring and Reporting to form the basis to move the ASR program from planning and construction to operations and maintenance. <u>Phase 2</u> Pilot Testing Program that evaluates the response of the aquifer to injection and recovery, which must demonstrate adequate recovery efficiency and water quality. <u>Phase 3</u> Full-Scale Implementation that considers the scaling-up ASR's hydraulic and water quality responses that can change with the scale of injection and recovery.

Benefits would be:

- 1. Utilize more fully the additional capacity of the Quill Water Treatment Facility.
- 2.Increase groundwater levels.
