**Agenda Title:** For Possible Action: To make a recommendation to the Board of Supervisors regarding the expenditure of up to \$10,000 from the Fiscal Year 2017 Redevelopment Revolving Fund, Special Event Equipment account, for the purchase of an outdoor projector for events. **Staff Summary:** The Redevelopment Authority allocated \$20,000 in the FY 2017 (current Fiscal Year) Redevelopment budget for the purchase of equipment and infrastructure to accommodate special events. The proposed could be used in conjunction with existing outdoor equipment including an inflatable movie screen and sound equipment to conduct public outdoor movie nights or live-streaming events, such as Epic Rides. The Carson City Visitors Bureau is purchasing sound equipment to accommodate the projector.

## **Proposed Motion**

I move to approve and recommend that the Board of Supervisors authorize the expenditure of up to \$10,000 from the Fiscal Year 2017 Redevelopment Revolving Fund, Special Event Equipment account, for the purchase of an outdoor projector for events as an expense incidental to the carrying out of the Redevelopment Plan that has been adopted by the Carson City Board of Supervisors, and based upon the findings that there is a causal connection between this redevelopment effort and the need for the expenses, the expenses are needed to ensure the success of the redevelopment plan and that the amount of the expenses to be given are minor in comparison to the money required for the overall redevelopment plan.

### **Previous Action**

November 7, 2016: The Redevelopment Authority Citizens Committee voted 6-0 to authorize \$10,000 for the proposed projector purchase, subject to the development of a management plan for the projector and associated equipment.

### **Background/Issues & Analysis**

On November 7, 2016, the Redevelopment Authority Citizens Committee (RACC) approved the purchase of a projector for outdoor events subject to the development of a management plan for the equipment prior to bringing it to the Redevelopment Authority for final approval. Than RACC member Garrett Lepire volunteered to take the lead to put together the management plan in conjunction with the appropriate City departments. The \$10,000 for the projector was subsequently allocated in the Redevelopment allocation plan approved by the Redevelopment Authority in March 2017.

Mr. Lepire has worked with the Carson City Visitors Bureau (CCVB) and the Carson City Library to get a commitment from the CCVB for the appropriate sound equipment and from the Library to manage the rental of

the equipment. The CCVB will purchase approximately \$5,000 in sound equipment to go with the projector and outdoor movie screen. The equipment will be managed and rented through the Library's equipment rental system, available for any organization that wishes to use it.
