**Staff Summary:** Foundation Forward has offered to gift to Carson City a Charters of Freedom Monument. The Charters of Freedom Monument contains original sized replicas of The Declaration of Independence, The United States Constitution, and the Bill of Rights similar to the display of the original founding document in the Rotunda of the National Archives in Washington, DC.

## **Background/Issues & Analysis**

The first step in getting a Charters of Freedom Monument installed in Carson City is to receive approval from the Board of Supervisors. Once approval is given, the City and Foundation Forward will move forward with locating the monuments in front of the Carson City Court House in the plaza area. Next, the Foundation Forward will work with a community board of advisors that the City has selected to assist them in community support and awareness, identifying potential donors and identifying potential corporate sponsorships. Once funding has been achieved, Foundation Forward will complete the construction of the monuments and have a patriotic ceremony of dedication for the citizens of the city. At the time of the dedication, the ownership of the setting will be turned over to Carson City.

Vance Patterson, the founder of Foundation Forward, Inc., will give a presentation and show a short video on the Charters of Freedom Monument project and be available to answer any questions.

**THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE**

# We the People

of the United States, in order to form a more perfect Union, establish Justice, insure domestic Tranquillity, provide for the common defence, promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity, do hereby ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America.

## Article I

Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Section 3. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature of the State in which they may be, and they shall hold their Offices for six Years, and until their Successors be chosen.

Section 4. The Times, Places and Manner of holding the Elections of Senators and Representatives, shall be prescribed in each State by the Legislature thereof; but the Congress may at any time by Law make or alter such Regulations, except as to the Places of Elections.

Section 5. The Congress shall assemble at least once in every Year, and such Meeting shall be held in the City of New York, until they shall have provided for the Meeting of the same in another City within the United States.

Section 6. The Senators and Representatives shall receive a Compensation for their Services, which shall be ascertained from Time to Time by the Congress, and such Compensation shall not be increased during the Term for which they shall be elected.

Section 7. All bills for raising Revenue shall originate in the House of Representatives; but the Senate may propose or concur with Amendments as to the Form of such Bills.

Section 8. The Congress shall have Power to lay and collect Taxes, Duties, Imposts and Excises, to regulate Commerce with foreign Nations, among the several States, and with the Indian Tribes; to borrow Money on the public Credit of the United States; to regulate the Value of Money, the Weight and Measure, to define the Offence of Bankruptcy, and to make all Laws which shall be necessary and proper for carrying into Execution the foregoing Powers, and all other Powers vested by this Constitution in the Government of the United States.

Section 9. The Privilege of the Writ of Habeas Corpus shall not be suspended, unless when in Cases of Rebellion or Invasion the public Safety may require it.

Section 10. No State shall enter into any Treaty, Alliance, or Confederation; grant Letters of Marque and Reprisal; or coin Money, emit Bills of Credit, or make any Thing but gold and silver Coin legal Tender for Payment.

Section 11. The President may grant Reprieves and Pardons for Offences against the United States, except in Cases of Impeachment.

Section 12. The Electors shall meet in one State, and they shall choose a President and Vice President, who shall hold their Offices for four Years, and until their Successors be chosen.

Section 13. The Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

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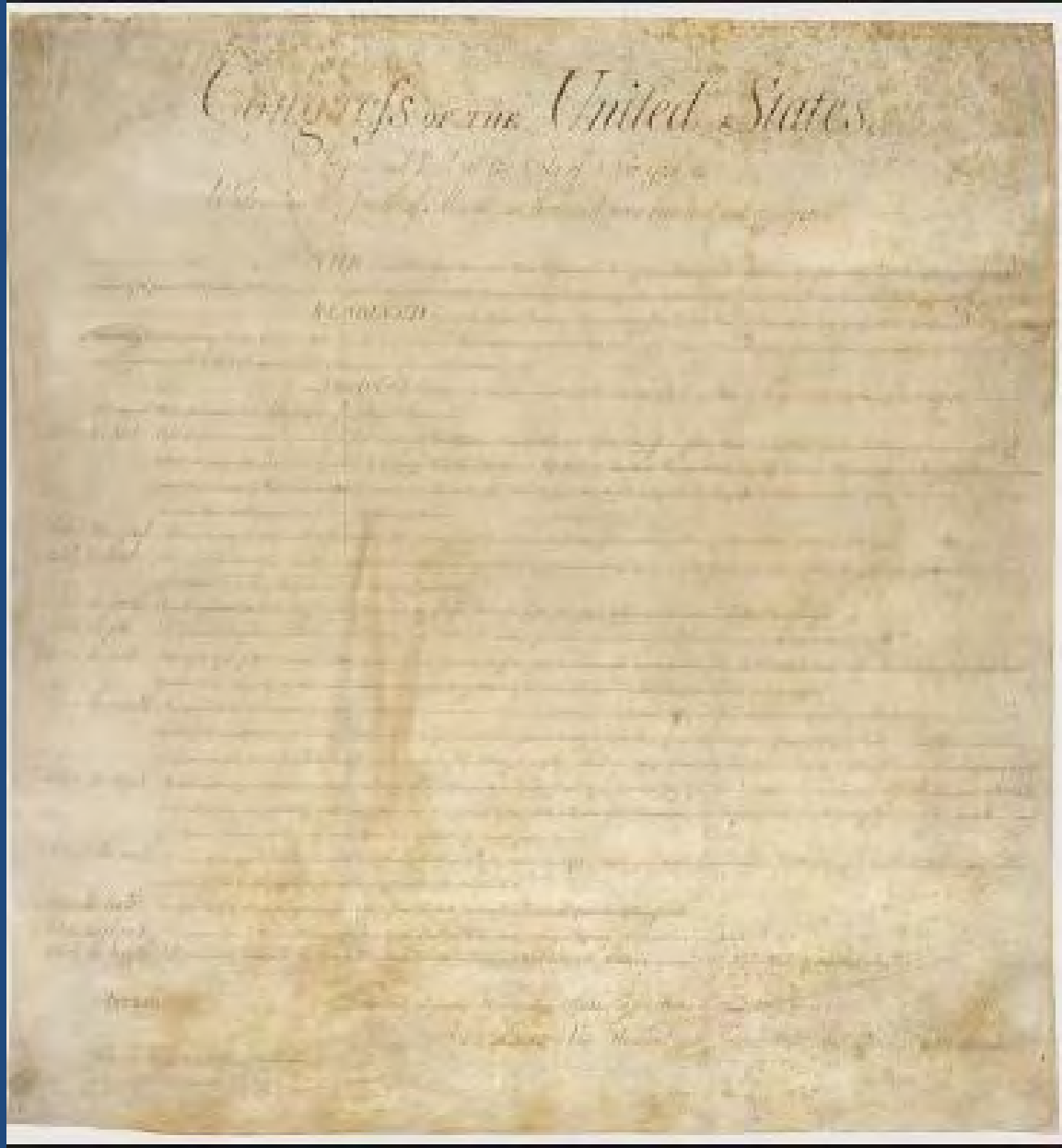

# We the People

of the United States, in order to form a more perfect Union, establish Justice, insure domestic Tranquillity, provide for the common defence, promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity, do hereby ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America.

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Section 3. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof, for six Years; and each Senator shall have the Qualifications requisite for Senators of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Section 4. The Times, Places and Manner of holding the Elections of Senators and Representatives, shall be prescribed in each State by the Legislature thereof; but the Congress may at any time by Law alter or amend such Regulations.

Section 5. The Congress shall assemble at least once in every Year, and such Meeting shall be held in the City of New York, until they provide otherwise by Law.

Section 6. The Senators and Representatives shall receive Compensation for their Services, which shall be ascertained from Time to Time by the Congress.

Section 7. The Congress shall have Power to lay and collect Taxes, Duties, Imposts and Excises, to regulate Commerce with foreign Nations, among the several States, and with the Indian Tribes; to borrow Money on the credit of the United States; to issue Bonds and Notes on the credit of the United States; to regulate the Value of Money, the Weight and Measure; to define Counterfeiting, and the Crimes and Misdemeanors; and to punish the same.

Section 8. The Congress shall have Power to declare War, to issue Letters of Marque and Reprisal, to grant Letters of Consue and Safe Conduct, to regulate the Army and Navy, and to make Rules concerning the Office and Duties of the Officers of the Army and Navy.

Section 9. The Privilege of the Writ of Habeas Corpus shall not be suspended, unless when in Cases of Rebellion or Invasion the public Safety may require it.

Section 10. No State shall enter into any Treaty, Alliance, or Confederation; grant Letters of Marque and Reprisal; coin Money; emit Bills of Credit; or make any Thing but gold and silver Coin a Tender in Payment of Debts.

Section 11. The President may grant Reprieves and Pardons for all Offences against the United States, except Treason, Felony, and Breach of the Peace.

Section 12. The Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

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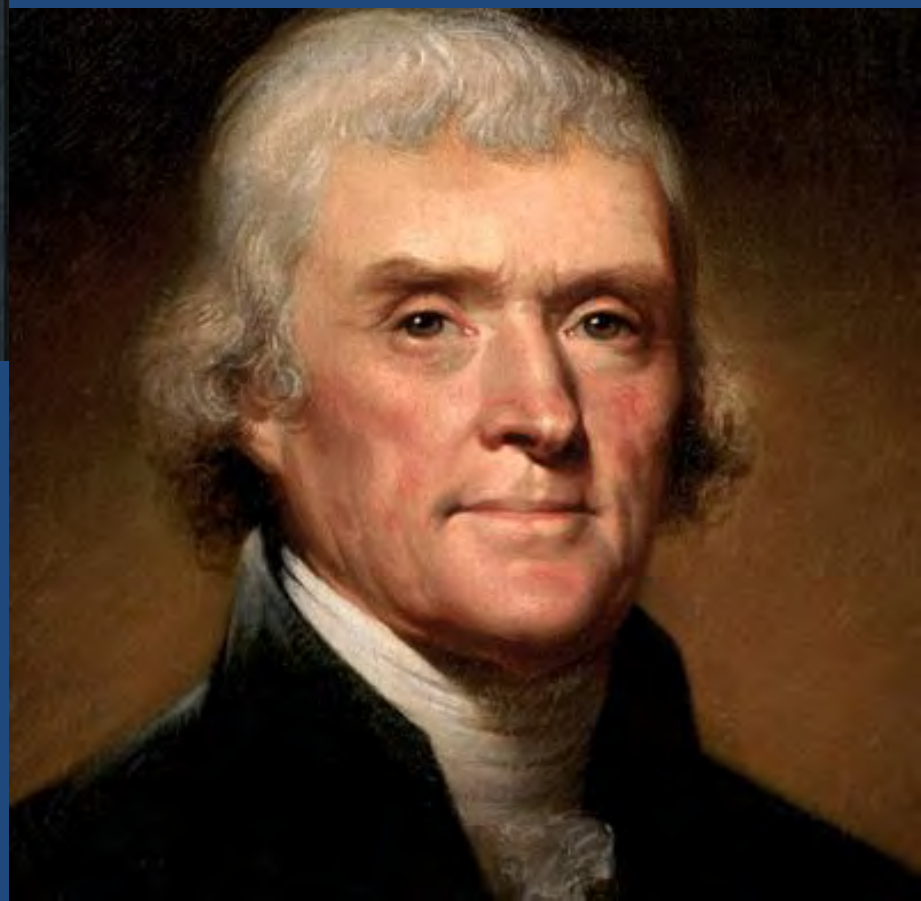

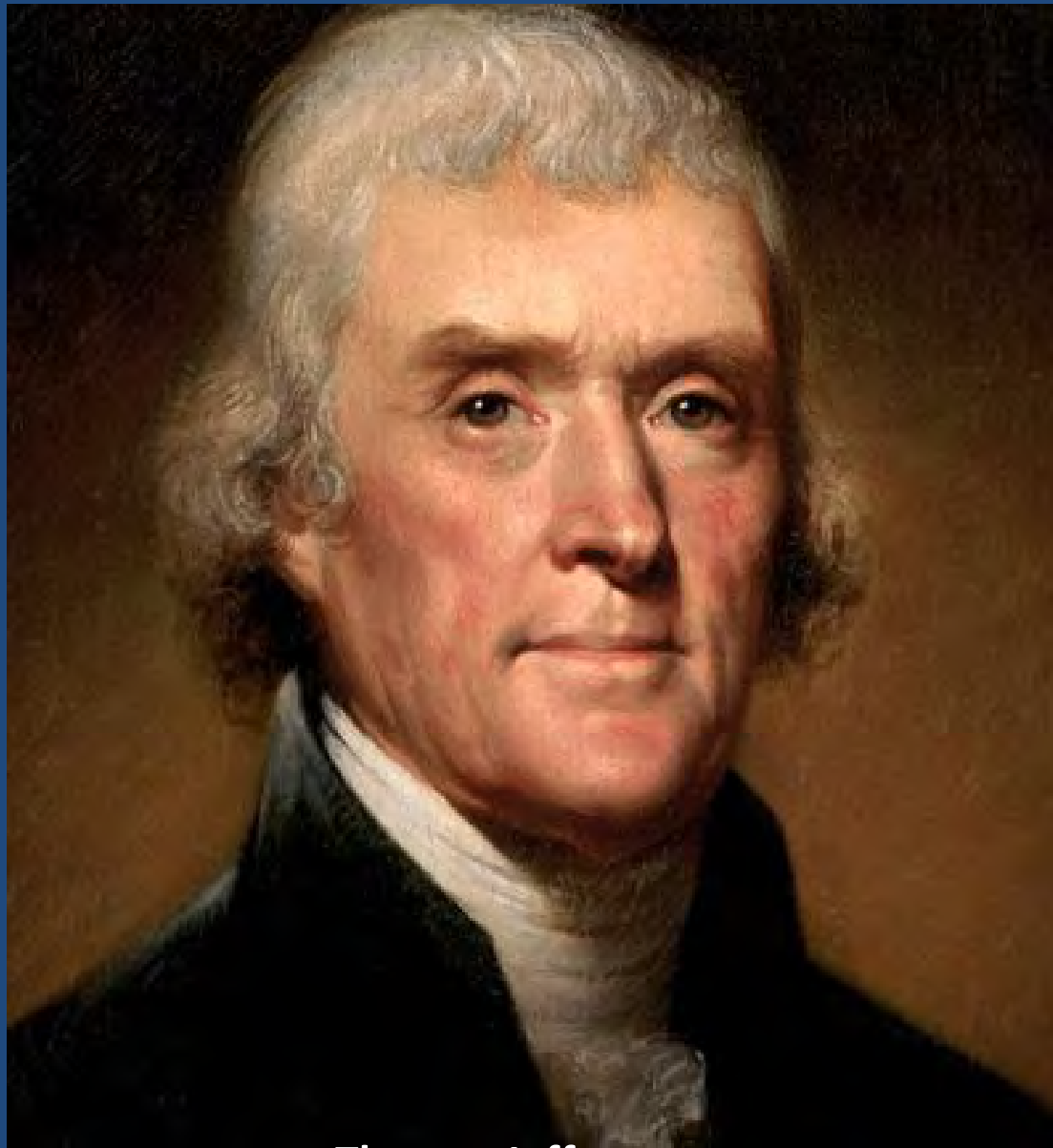

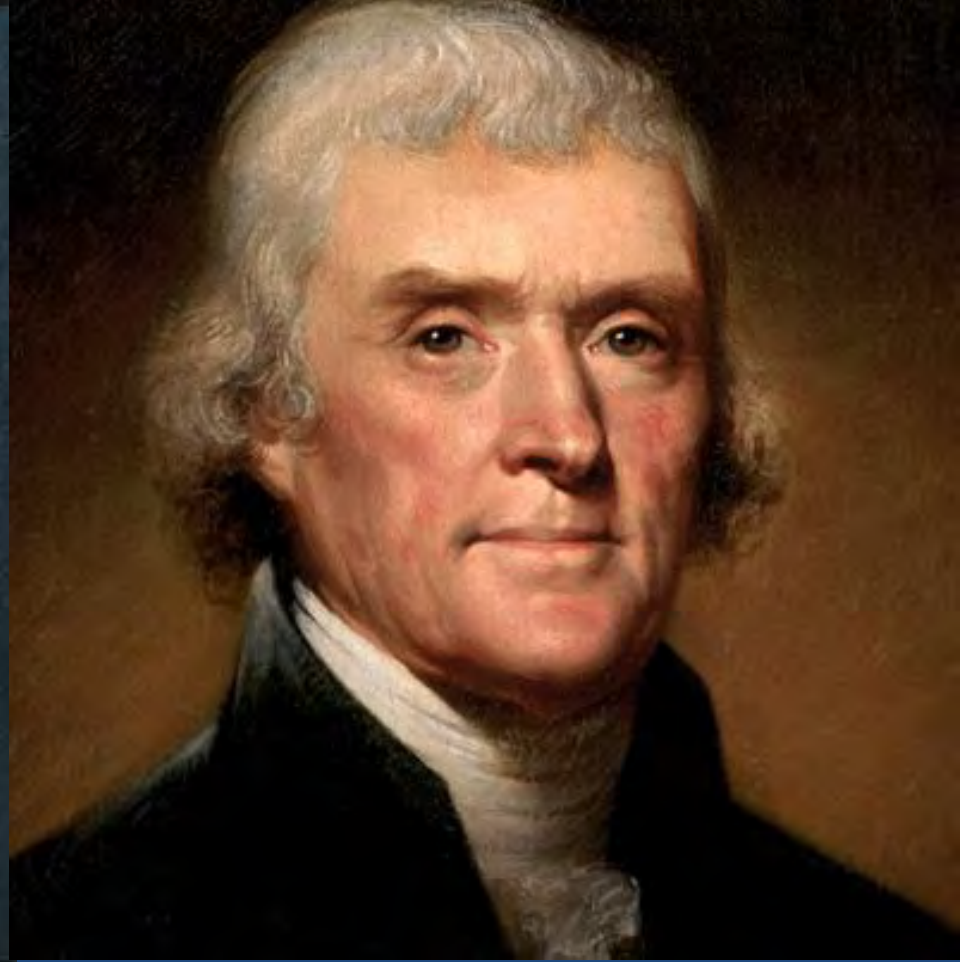

The unanimous Declaration of the thirteen united States of America

*We the People of the United States, in Order to form a more perfect Union, establish Justice, insure domestic Tranquillity, provide for the common defence, promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity, do hereby constitute and ordain this Constitution for the United States of America*  
**Article I.**

*All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.*  
**Section 1.** The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

*The House of Representatives shall elect their Speaker and other Officers; and shall have the sole Power of Impeachment.*  
**Section 2.** The House of Representatives shall elect their Speaker and other Officers; and shall have the sole Power of Impeachment.

*The Senate shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof, for six Years; and each Senator shall have the Qualifications requisite for Senators of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.*  
**Section 1.** The Senate shall elect their President and other Officers; and shall have the sole Power of Impeachment.

*THE* Representatives of the United States of America, in Congress assembled, Whereas, We the People of the United States, in order to form a more perfect Union, establish Justice, insure domestic Tranquillity, provide for the common defence, promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity, do hereby ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America.

*ARTICLES*

*Article the first.*  
 Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

*Article the second.*  
 Section 1. The executive Power shall be vested in a President of the United States.

*Article the third.*  
 Section 1. The judicial Power shall be vested in one Supreme Court, and in such inferior Courts as the Congress may from time to time ordain and establish.

*Article the fourth.*  
 Section 1. The United States shall guarantee to every State in this Union a Republican Form of Government.

*Article the fifth.*  
 Section 1. No State shall be deprived of its equal Suffrage in the Senate.

*Article the sixth.*  
 Section 1. This Constitution, the Laws of the United States which shall be made in Pursuance thereof, and all Treaties made, or which shall be made, under the Authority of the United States, shall be the supreme Law of the Land.

*Article the seventh.*  
 Section 1. The Senate shall have the sole and exclusive Power of Impeachment.

*Article the eighth.*  
 Section 1. The House of Representatives shall have the sole and exclusive Power of Impeachment.

*Article the ninth.*  
 Section 1. The Privileges, Immunities and Jurisdictions attached to this Office of Senator or Representative shall not be infringed.

*Article the tenth.*  
 Section 1. The States may appoint or elect Officers in their respective Militias, and may provide for their Organization, Armament and Discipline, subject to the Discipline actually prescribed by Congress.

*Article the eleventh.*  
 Section 1. The Judicial Power shall not be extended to Cases arising between two or more States, Citizens of different States, or Citizens of one State and a foreign Country.

*Article the twelfth.*  
 Section 1. The Electors in each State shall have the sole and exclusive Power to meet in one full State Convention, or in such Number of separate Counties, Townships or Wards, as the Legislature of that State may direct, to vote for all the Electors in that State.

*Article the thirteenth.*  
 Section 1. Neither Slavery nor involuntary Servitude, except as a Punishment for Crime whereof the Party shall be convicted, shall exist within the United States, or any Place subject to their Jurisdiction.

*Article the fourteenth.*  
 Section 1. All persons born or naturalized in the United States, and who are subject to its Jurisdiction, are Citizens of the United States.

*Article the fifteenth.*  
 Section 1. The right of Citizens of the United States to vote shall not be denied or abridged on account of Race or Color.

*Article the sixteenth.*  
 Section 1. The Congress shall have Power to lay and collect Taxes on Income, from whatever Source derived, and on Profits and Gains from every Source, and on the Gains from the Sale of Intangible Property, and to impose and collect a Tax or Taxes on Succession, Gifts, and the Excess Termination Value of Certain Intangible Property, and on the Accumulated Income or Gains from the Sale of Intangible Property, and on the Accumulated Income or Gains from the Sale of Intangible Property, and on the Accumulated Income or Gains from the Sale of Intangible Property, and on the Accumulated Income or Gains from the Sale of Intangible Property.

*Article the seventeenth.*  
 Section 1. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, elected by the People of the State in which they so reside, for six Years, and each Senator shall have one Vote.

*Article the eighteenth.*  
 Section 1. After one Year from the Ratification of this Article the manufacture, Sale, or Transportation of Intoxicating Liquors within the United States, or the Importation thereof into the United States, shall be prohibited by Congress.

*Article the nineteenth.*  
 Section 1. The right of Citizens of the United States to vote shall not be denied or abridged on account of Sex.

*Article the twentieth.*  
 Section 1. The Terms of the President and Vice President shall begin at Noon on January 20th next following their Election, and the Terms of Senators and Representatives shall begin at Noon on January 3rd next following their Election, except that the Terms of Representatives shall begin at Noon on January 3rd next following their Election, and the Terms of Senators and Representatives shall begin at Noon on January 3rd next following their Election.

*Article the twenty-first.*  
 Section 1. The third Article of Amendment to the Constitution of the United States shall be inoperative unless it shall have been ratified as an Amendment to this Constitution by three-fourths of the States which shall ratify the same.

*Article the twenty-second.*  
 Section 1. No Person shall be elected President of the United States unless he shall have been at least 14 Years old and 14 Years a Citizen before he shall be elected, and he shall have been seven Years a Citizen at the Time he moves into the United States.

*Article the twenty-third.*  
 Section 1. The District constituting the Seat of the Government of the United States, shall be composed of as many Electors in Congress as the whole State in which it shall be located shall have in Congress.

*Article the twenty-fourth.*  
 Section 1. The Congress shall have Power to enforce by appropriate Legislation the Provisions of this Article.

*Article the twenty-fifth.*  
 Section 1. In Case of the Removal from Office of the President, or of his Death, or of his Inability to discharge the Powers and Duties of the said Office, the Vice President shall act as President until such Time as a President shall be chosen.

*Article the twenty-sixth.*  
 Section 1. The right of Citizens of the United States to vote shall not be denied or abridged on account of Age, provided that the States may, subject to the Enforcement of this Article by the Congress, enforce minimum voting age limits which shall not be less than 18 Years.

*Article the twenty-seventh.*  
 Section 1. The Congress shall not vary the Compensation for the Services of the Senators and Representatives.

*Article the twenty-eighth.*  
 Section 1. The Congress shall have Power to enforce by appropriate Legislation the Provisions of this Article.

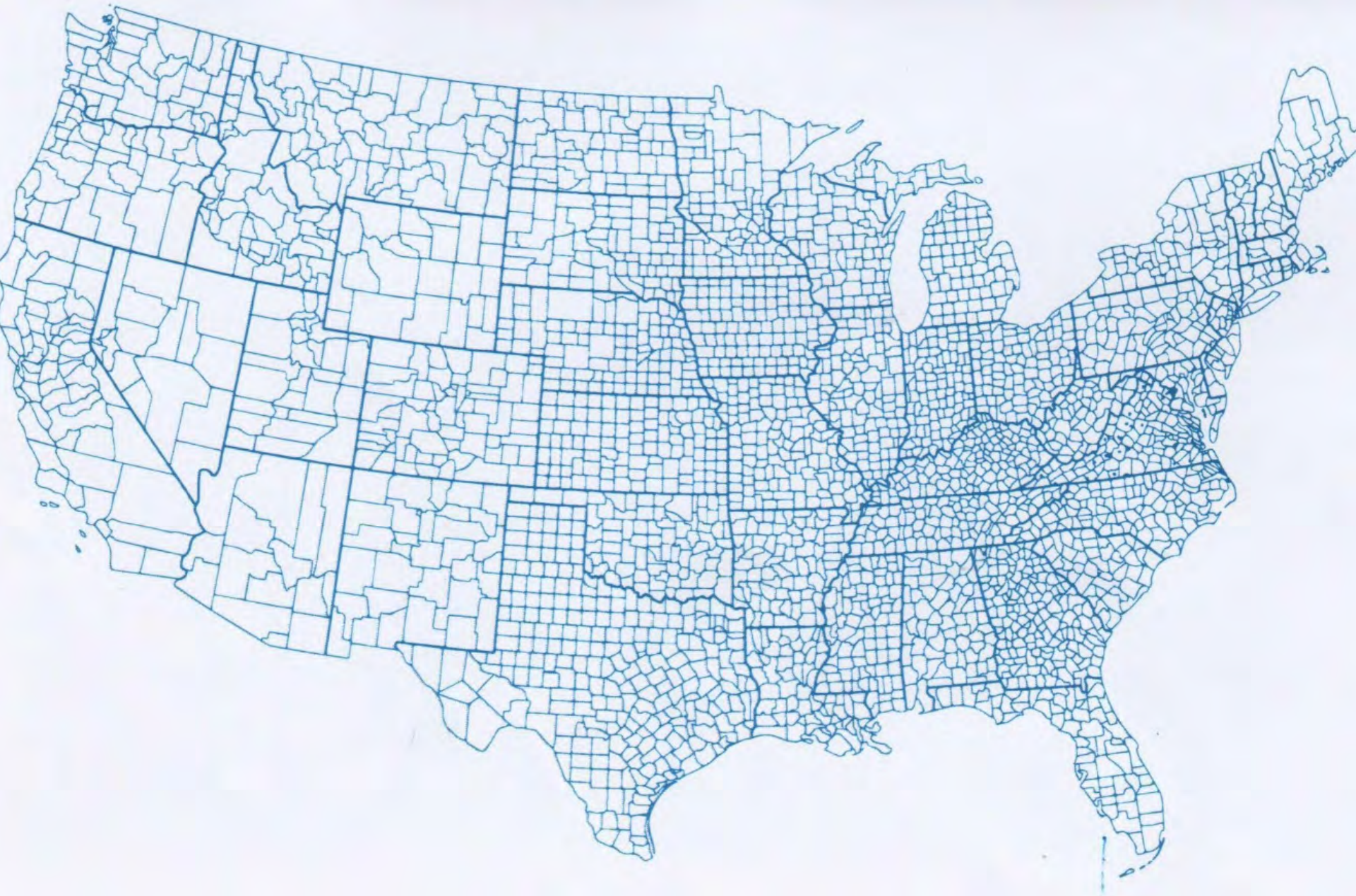


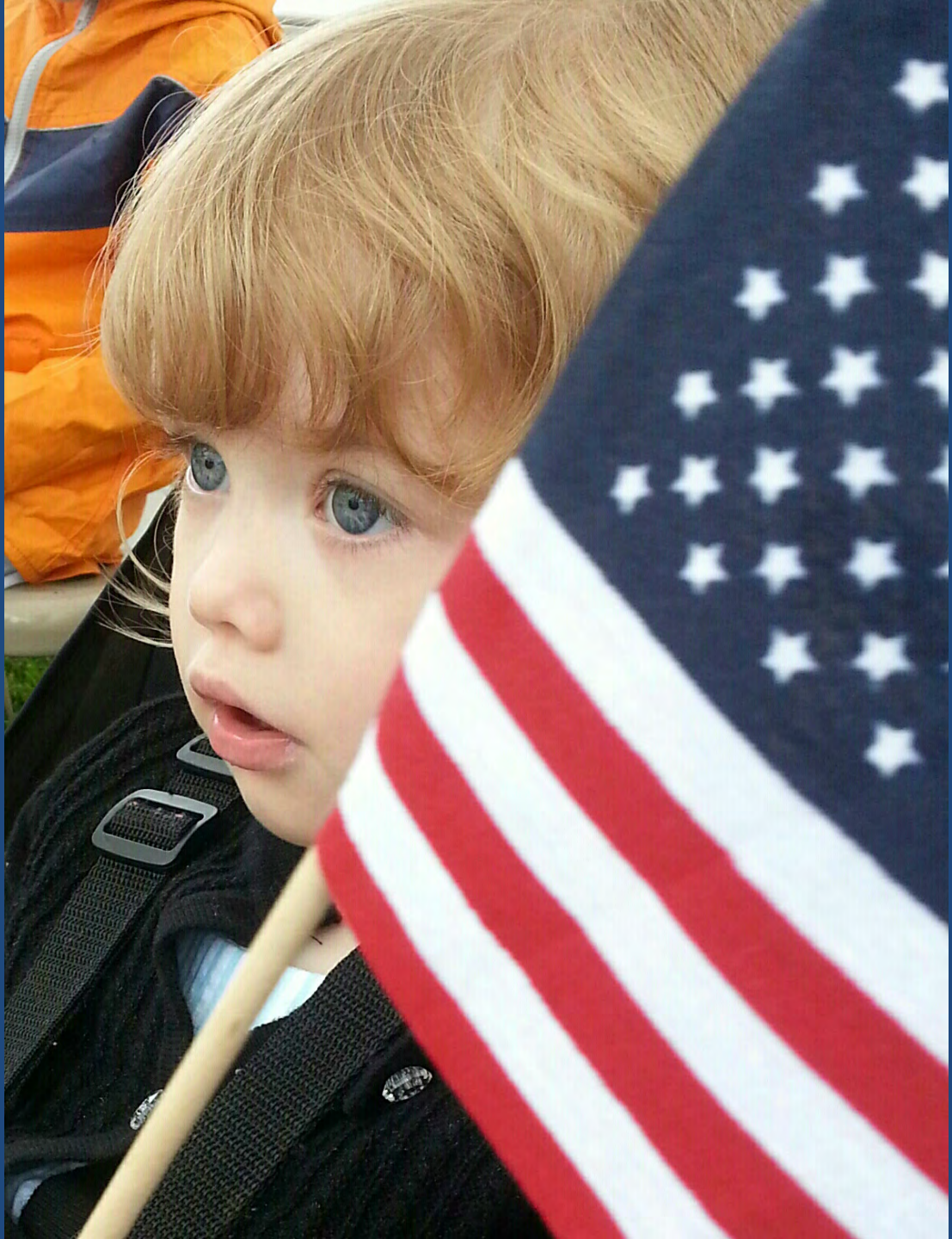




Article I  
Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.  
Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors in that State.  
Section 3. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature of the State for which they are respectively chosen, and they shall have the Qualifications requisite for Senators in that State.  
Section 4. The Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors in that State.  
Section 5. The Senate shall have the sole Power to try all Cases of Impeachment.  
Section 6. The Senators and Representatives before mentioned, and those from time to time elected and chosen to fill the Places of the Senators and Representatives who may have vacancies during their respective Terms of Service, shall, when assembled, constitute Congress of the United States, and when ascertained a quorum is present, they shall constitute a Majority to do Business as such.

Article II  
Section 1. The executive Power shall be vested in a President of the United States of America.  
Section 2. The President shall hold Office, for the Term of four Years, and until he shall have qualified. He shall be inaugurated on the first Wednesday after the first Monday in October, but he shall not assume the Office until after the expiration of the Term of the President to whom next succeeding he shall have succeeded.  
Section 3. The President shall, before entering on the Office, take the following Oath or Affirmation: "I do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will faithfully execute the Office of President of the United States, and will to the best of my Ability, preserve, protect and defend the Constitution of the United States."

# CONSTRUCTION

## FOUNDATION FORWARD WILL:

1. Contract with the suppliers to provide the rock work, bronze documents, glazing, bronze plaques, vault, time capsule, and all installation work. Materials take 4 to 6 weeks to procure.
2. Work with local contractor to do the foundation work according to the prints supplied by Foundation Forward's architect.
3. This will be a turn-key job by Foundation Forward. Setting takes 1 to 2 weeks to complete.

## CARSON CITY COUNTY COMMUNITY WILL:

1. Do site preparation: moving sprinkler lines, tree and shrub removal, power line relocation, grading, etc.
2. Be responsible for landscaping: grass, gravel, benches, sidewalks, etc.
