Background/Issues & Analysis

In 2015 the Sheriff's Office was awarded the Community Policing Grant / COPS in Schools. This grant's match funds are split by both the Sheriff's Office and the Carson City School District. We are currently moving into the last year of the paid portion of the grant, followed by at least one year with no Federal assistance. The grant is a 36 month salary only grant to fund 3 entry level officers. We will continue the grant until at least 09/30/18 with the option to extend until Dec. 14, 2018 as the first claim was submitted for pay period Dec. 15-24, 2015. This would create the full 36 month salary payment of the grant. This program as been a great success in both the schools as well as in the community. Operations continue to follow the role of the School Resource Officer; education, prevention, and enforcement through direct and continuous contact on a daily basis with educators, administrators and the youth in the community.

- 36 month Salary Grant
- Total award amount \$375,000
- Grant match to be shared between CCSD and City
- City/District match per year:
 - One: 25%
 - Two: 60%
 - Three: 79%
- Pays for 3 "Entry Level Deputies"
- Grant awarded 10/01/2015
- Grant secluded end date 09/30/2018
- First grant claim submitted for pay period 27 (Dec. 15-24, 2015)
- Extension can be granted from start of grant to first claim (i.e. to pay to Dec.14, 2018)


