- Freedom Monument Project at the Carson City Public Safety Complex Plaza is complete. Dedication ceremony will be June 14th at 12pm.




## **Public Works**

S. Carson Street Project – Staff are coordinating ongoing discussions with Federal Highways and Nevada DOT to execute the TIGER grant agreement for access to the recently awarded \$7.57M in grant funds for the project. Staff are also coordinating with Nevada DOT for relinquishment of S. Carson Street, anticipated this summer. The project remains on schedule, with construction expected to begin in Spring / Summer 2019.

➤ Downtown Curry Streetscape Improvement Project – \$4M project includes major utility and streetscape improvements along Curry Street from Musser to Robinson. The contractor will be starting construction the second week of May.





# Public Works, Continued

> Pavement Management Plan - Carson City's FY 2019-2023 Pavement Management Plan was approved at the April I Ith meeting of the Regional Transportation Commission (RTC). Staff developed the Pavement Management Plan, which formalizes and establishes an efficient and effective strategy for preserving and maintaining the City's 676 lane-miles of roadway. The Plan establishes five performance districts within the City and a five-year rotating schedule to streamline work efforts. The Plan provides a predictable use of roadway funding while maintaining flexibility for unplanned City projects and "match" for grant funding opportunities, as needed. Staff has begun implementation of the plan, starting with pavement inspections of roadways within Performance District I for selection of projects using 2019 transportation infrastructure funding. Solid Waste Management - The City's Consultant, Sloan Vazquez McAffee, is compiling all the data from the discussion at the April 5<sup>th</sup> Board of Supervisors meeting to develop a draft Request for Proposal (RFP) that will be presented to the Board on June 21<sup>st</sup>.


➤ Utility Finance Oversight Committee – A special meeting will be held on May 21<sup>st</sup> to discuss refinancing higher interest rate water bonds with the debt service savings used to finance a portion of the east / west transmission line project.

Renovation of the former animal services facility for use as the JAC operations facility is almost complete and they are expected to move in on June 1<sup>st</sup>.


Growth management will be discussed at the next planning commission meeting on May 30<sup>th</sup> with the recommendations presented to the Board in July.






