### **Background/Issues & Analysis**

The following notice was given:

- On July 19, 2018, email notification of the potential ordinance changes were sent on to cannabis industry representatives.
- On July 25, 2018, an outreach meeting was held with cannabis industry representatives. There were no changes requested by the cannabis industry at this meeting. The proposed changes were well-received.
- On July 25, 2018, email notifications of the potential ordinance changes were sent to Aaron West-Nevada Builders Alliance and Don Tatro of Builders Association of Northern Nevada.
- On August 1, 2018, a meeting was held for the building industry to solicit feedback. Comments were heard at the meeting. A request was made to clarify the meaning in some sections in Chapter 9 and Chapter 39. Those changes were incorporated in to the document where possible.
- On August 20, 2018, letters were sent to the Carson City Chamber of Commerce, Nevada Builders Alliance, and Builders Association of Northern Nevada, the industry stakeholders. The letters consisted of an explanation in regard to the proposed changes and web links to the materials. This draft Business Impact Statement was included with the materials, along with the draft ordinance changes.

- The comments received during the public meetings were generally positive. Stakeholders were appreciative that Carson City was participating in a regional approach.
- It is arguable that a Business Impact Statement is not needed. Permit fees are currently in place for construction permits and no fee increase is planned at this time. However, it is possible that there could be a fee increase before the next cycle of code amendments takes place. Since the imposition of a fee is authorized by this code, notice was provided to the stakeholders and this Business Impact Statement was prepared.
- No comments were received as a result of the notice sent out on August 20, 2018.
- Based on the above, staff is asking the Board of Supervisors to make a finding that the changes to CCMC do not impose a direct or significant economic burden or directly restrict the formation, operation, or expansion of a business.

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# **BUSINESS IMPACT STATEMENT**

This Business Impact Statement was prepared in accordance with the provisions of NRS (Nevada Revised Statutes) 237.030 to 237.150, inclusive, as a statutory prerequisite to the adoption of any rule\*\*\*, as that term is defined in NRS 237.060, by the Carson City Board of Supervisors.

\*\*\* A "rule" may include an ordinance, or an action taken by the Board, that imposes, increases or changes the basis for the calculation of a fee which is paid in whole or in substantial part by businesses. A "rule" does not include actions that impose, increase or change the basis for the calculation of: (1) special assessments imposed pursuant to NRS chapter 271; (2) impact fees imposed pursuant to NRS chapter 278B; (3) fees for remediation imposed pursuant to NRS chapter 540A; (4) taxes ad valorem; (5) sales and use taxes; or (6) a fee that has been negotiated pursuant to a contract between a business and Carson City. A "rule" also does not include: an action taken by the Board that approves, amends or augments the annual budget of Carson City; an ordinance adopted by the Board pursuant to a provision of NRS chapter 271, 271A, 278, 278A, 278B or 350; an ordinance adopted or action taken by the Board that authorizes or relates to the issuance of bonds or other evidence of debt of Carson City; or any rule for which Carson City does not have the authority to consider less stringent alternatives, including, for example, a rule that Carson City is required to adopt pursuant to a federal or state statute or regulation or to a contract into which Carson City has entered.
