Agenda Title: For Possible Action: To make a recommendation to the Board of Supervisors regarding the expenditure of up to \$400,360 from the Fiscal Year 2019 Redevelopment Revolving Fund for the Bob Boldrick Theater rehabilitation project. (Lee Plemel, lplemel@carson.org)

Staff Summary: The Redevelopment Authority allocated \$247,996 in the FY 2019 budget for the Bob Boldrick Theater (Community Center) rehabilitation project, with direction from the Board of Supervisors to include the option of using any roll-forward funds from the prior years' budget for the project. Upon completion of the FY 2018 audit, an additional \$152,364 is available from the Redevelopment Revolving Fund and not allocated to other projects at this time, for a total available of up to \$400,360 for this project. The project will replace the theater seats and make other improvements to refurbish the theater interior. The Redevelopment Authority must make a recommendation to the Board of Supervisors regarding the authorization of any expenditure from the Redevelopment Revolving Fund that is incidental to the carrying out of the Redevelopment Plan.

Proposed Motion

I move to approve and recommend that the Board of Supervisors authorize the expenditure of \$252,996 [or other amount determined by the Redevelopment Authority] from the Fiscal Year 2019 Redevelopment Revolving Fund for the Bob Boldrick Theater rehabilitation project.

Previous Action

October 18, 2018: The Board of Supervisors approved the purchase of the theater replacement seats. (See attached Board staff report and action from October 18, 2018.)

November 5, 2018: The Redevelopment Authority Citizens Committee voted 6-0 (1 vacancy) to authorize the expenditure of \$252,996 for the project. (At the time of RACC action, which was before completion of the FY 2018 audit, \$252,996 was the amount that was known to be available for the project.)

Background/Issues & Analysis

The Bob Boldrick Theater rehabilitation project includes the replacement of the theater seats, new carpeting, painting, and replacement of the acoustic panes. The FY 2019 Redevelopment budget included \$247,996 for this project. When the Redevelopment Authority approved the current Redevelopment Discretionary Funds Tentative Expenditures plan in March 2018, it included direction to reallocate any extra FY 2019 Redevelopment funds to the theater project. There was \$5,000 allocated to purchase a new portable sound system in FY 2018 that is unspent and, after discussion with Parks staff, it was been determined that existing

portable sound equipment is adequate and there is no need for the additional purchase. Therefore, city staff and RACC recommended adding the \$5,000 to the theater project for a total of \$252,996.

The FY 2018 audit was completed in November, and an additional \$152,364 (including the sound system funds) was identified as undesignated funds and available for use in the FY 2019 budget. When added to the original \$247,996 identified for this project in the FY 2019 budget, a total of up to \$400,360 may be authorized for the project from the Redevelopment Revolving Fund.

The following budget was presented with the bid for the theater seats, with the Redevelopment Revolving Fund budget updated to reflect the amount proposed with this item:

The project can be completed with the proposed funding of \$252,996 from the Redevelopment Fund. This would allow the extra \$147,364 to be used on other Redevelopment programs or projects. However, the addition of Redevelopment Funds into the project budget would allow for the other Question 18 and/or Capital Projects funds to be used for their applicable purpose on other projects in the City. The Redevelopment Authority and Board of Supervisors may consider increasing the amount of funding from Redevelopment above the recommended amount of \$252,996 and reduce funding from other sources commensurately.

Staff Summary: This contract is for the purchase and installation of new theater seats at the Carson City Community Center's Bob Boldrick Theater. The contract scope includes removal of the existing theater seating, and furnishing and installing new theater seats for \$202,188.00, plus a contingency amount of \$20,218.80, for the total amount of \$222,406.80, to be funded from the Quality of Life and Redevelopment Revolving Funds. William Peterson and Associates is an authorized dealer of Navetta Theater Seating through the awarded contract holder TIPS-USA Furniture, Contract No. 170302. The city has selected the CAL133 foam option, as recommended by the Fire Department to be in compliance with fire code.






