July/August 2018


 Assembled design team and initiated design for the South Carson Complete Streets Project

#### Public Outreach



- September 2016 & March 2017- Public meetings to select preferred street cross sections
- October 2018- Visited 250 businesses
  - Majority of businesses were positive about the project
- December 2018- General informational meeting





#### Public Outreach



- Comments and Feedback:
  - Impacts during construction
  - Landscaping obstructing business signage
  - Pedestrian crossings
  - Existing raised center medians
  - Deceleration lanes

- Multi-use path connectivity and bike lanes
- Roundabout
- Traffic congestion with lane reductions




#### South of Fairview

 > 40% reduction since opening of Phase 2B of I-580 in 2017

#### Fifth to Stewart


- 33% reduction with opening of Phase 2A of I-580 in 2009 and 30% reduction since opening of Phase 2B of I-580 in 2017
- Traffic demand modeling-Existing and 2040
- Optimize signal timing




### Traffic Reductions



- South of Fairview
  - > 40% reduction since opening of Phase 2B of I-580 in 2017
- Fifth to Stewart
  - 33% reduction with opening of Phase 2A of I-580 in 2009 and 30% reduction since opening of Phase 2B of I-580 in 2017
- Traffic demand modeling-Existing and 2040
- Optimize signal timing





#### Stewart Street Roundabout



- Design highlights:
  - Increased efficiency
  - Improved safety- Anticipate 50% reduction in crashes (Societal cost savings of \$2.8M)
  - Single lane roundabout = easier to navigate
  - Decreased operations & maintenance costs
  - Provides gateway to the City

Preferred Option- Single lane roundabout with northbound and southbound bypasses

# Project Funding



Total Project Funding: \$18,696,000

Redevelopment = \$205,000 Infrastructure = \$1,040,000 TIGER = \$7,570,000 State = \$6,251,000 Stormwater = \$2,900,000 Water = \$450,000 Sewer = \$280,000

Approximately 75% funded by state and federal funds

  - April/May 2019- 90% design
  - June/July 2019- Final design
- Public meetings and workshops:
  - January/February 2019- Project workshop & survey
- Board and committee updates (RACC, RTC, BOS):

  - January 10- Historical Resources Commission meeting
  - January/February 2019- 60% design update
  - April/May 2019- 90% design update
- Construction- Start by end of 2019
