Staff Summary: The total funding for FY 2020 is \$380,000; \$79,250 to be awarded for adult programs, \$66,250 to be awarded for youth programs and \$114,500 to be awarded for general non-competitive programs. \$120,000 is to be awarded from the Quality of Life Initiative to the Boys and Girls Club of Western Nevada which is based on the annual sales

tax, with a maximum of \$120,000 per year.

The decision to allocate General Fund CSSG funding to Carson City non-profit organizations is based on the Application Review Work Group (ARWG) and Partnership Carson City Executive Board ranking of applications. A community-based ARWG reviewed and scored adult program applications on April 30, 2019, for recommendation to the Board of Supervisors. On May 2, 2019 Partnership Carson City Executive Board reviewed and scored youth program applications for recommendation to the Board of Supervisors.

#### **Proposed Motion**

I move to approve the Community Support Services Grant funding for FY2020 and the allocated funding for the Boys and Girls Club of Western Nevada as recommended.

### **Board's Strategic Goal**

Quality of Life

#### **Previous Action**

On April 18, 2019 the Board of Supervisors approved the CSSG funding and Quality of Life Initiative for FY 2020.

## Background/Issues & Analysis

The CSSG program will award \$260,000 from the General Fund to non-profit organizations that address a critical need in Carson City. Five programs have been approved by the Board of Supervisors to be automatically funded every year for a total of \$114,500. The remaining \$145,500 in funding is available through a competitive grant process, with \$79,250 to be awarded to adult programs and \$66,250 to be awarded to youth programs.

\$120,000 will be awarded from the Quality of Life Initiative to the Boys and Girls Club of Western Nevada. The calculation is based on the annual sales tax, with a maximum of \$120,000 per year.

After all programs have been approved for funding, funds will be moved to a line item specific to the program. \$120,000 is budgeted in the Quality of Life Fund account #254-5012-452-14-44, for the Boys and Girls Club.

**Subject**: CSSG FY 2020 Community Support Services Grant

The following is a summary of the Community Support Services Grant (CSSG) applicants for adult and youth programs for FY2020, as ranked by the Application Review Work Group and Partnership Carson City Executive Board, also provided is a list of general non-competitive programs as well as a funding recommendation for the Boys and Girls Club of Western Nevada.

The total funding available is \$380,000; \$79,250 to be awarded for adult programs, \$66,250 to be awarded for youth programs, \$114,500 to be awarded for non-competitive programs and \$120,000 to be awarded for the Boys and Girls Club of Western Nevada. All projects meet CSSG program critical needs and are eligible for funding.

### **CSSG RECOMMENDATIONS:**

Total Available for Adult Programs = \$79,250

1) Project Name: Senior Independent Living Programs

Agency: Nevada Rural Counties RSVP, Inc.

Funding Request: \$25,000 Recommendation: \$16,000 Application Score: 90.6%

Description: RSVP provides critical services to help homebound and low-income

seniors and veteran seniors. In addition, the services allow seniors and senior veterans to be more independent and to stay in their homes. Services include, but are not limited to the following: respite care transportation, lifeline alert emergency response system, exercise

programs, food delivery and suicide prevention.

2) Project Name: Domestic Violence Victim Assistance Project

Agency: Volunteer Attorneys for Rural Nevada (VARN)

Funding Request: \$25,000 Recommendation: \$13,000 Application Score: 83.6%

Description: VARN provides free civil legal services to low-income Carson City victims

of domestic violence. Services to victims include: advocacy, crisis counseling, safety planning, representation in protection order hearings

and comprehensive legal assistance.

3) Project Name: Homelessness Prevention for At-Risk Youth and Senior Citizens

Agency: Saint Teresa of Avila Conferences, Saint Vincent de Paul Society

Funding Request: \$12,000 Recommendation: \$11,750 Application Score: 82.8%

Description: St. Vincent serves the poor in Carson City with financial assistance to

combat short-term poverty. The program is set up to provide financial support for short-term emergency housing for low income households. More specifically, the priority categories for this program are families with at-risk youth and senior citizens. The program assists all individuals and families but prioritizes their requests based on the two categories

mentioned above.

4) Project Name: NetWorX

Agency: Capital City Circles

Funding Request: \$16,380 Recommendation: \$11,500 Application Score: **76.6%** 

Description: C.I.R.C.L.E.S. offers a cooperative program for Carson City families

struggling both vocationally and financially. The national model used to help families out of poverty is a three phased system. The system called NetWorX helps families to 1) identify and breakdown down barriers to poverty, 2) matches members with professional community members who act as allies 3) participants act as mentors to new clients entering into phase one of the program. The end goal is to inspire and equip

families with the tools they need to thrive, not just survive.

5) Project Name: Client Advocate Program
Agency: United Latino Community

Funding Request: \$32,818 Recommendation: **\$10,500** Application Score: **65.6%** 

Description: United Latino Community assists Carson City Hispanic and Latino

individuals and families with a wide range of health and human services. The services included in this program are administered by a bi-lingual Community Advocate and are as follows: referrals, translators, job placement, advocacy, citizenship instruction, healthcare/mental health

information and legal immigration assistance.

6) Project Name: Emergency Housing/Lodging Assistance

Agency: The Salvation Army

Funding Request: \$35,000 Recommendation: **\$10,500** Application Score: **60.6%** 

Description: This program will help keep families with children, seniors and disabled

individuals from becoming homeless by assisting with rent when a client is in danger of being evicted. This program provides emergency and/or

short-term lodging to families or individuals.

7) Project Name: Was not stated in the application
Agency: Ormsby Association of Carson City

Funding Request: \$13,000 Recommendation: **\$6,000** Application Score: **44.2%** 

Description: The Ormsby Association runs several programs that assist individuals

with developmental delays. The programs assist individuals in job training, medical referrals and inclusion in recreation activities. In addition, the program staff teach everyday skills on how to do laundry, how to grocery shop, how to plan meals and how to stay safe in our

community.
