DISCUSSION:


As noted in the above summary, \$50,000 has been allocated in the draft FY 2020 Redevelopment budget to complete improvements at the front of the Children's Museum. The final budget is expected to be adopted by the Redevelopment Authority on May 20, 2019. The RACC and Redevelopment Authority have previously review draft plans for the improvements. The proposed action is required to authorize the expenditure of funds for the project.


The applicant obtained Special Use Permit approval from the Planning Commission and Historic Resource Commission approval in 2018 to complete an on-site, secured playground area in front of the existing Children's Museum building. The plans have been modified and reduced slightly since those approvals, primarily due to the State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) prohibiting the Museum from replacing the existing front fence with a six-foot wrought iron fence.

The Museum's current plans are to replace the existing concrete in the front plaza area with pavers. The existing concrete in the plaza is buckling and is a safety hazard and, therefore, needs to be replaced. The pavers will provide for a more attractive surface and will better match the new downtown sidewalk improvements. The plans also include replacing landscaping, benches and other amenities in the plaza. They are also still considering alternative ground cover alternatives for some play areas for children, as may be permitted through reviews by SHPO and the Carson City Historic Resources Commission. The proposed action would authorize the expenditure of \$43,200 to complete these improvements.

The Museum's latest plan also includes a proposal to remove the existing signage from the front of the building and consolidate it onto a single message center sign at the corner of the property. Since that was not part of the original plan that was approved by the RACC and the Redevelopment Authority, a separate approval will be required for the sign once details are available regarding the sign design and location. City staff supports the concept of the proposed sign as it will consolidate existing signage that detracts from the historical façade of the building.

Add outdoor furniture (picnic table & benches)


Add landscaping to existing planters/irrigation




