Staff Summary: The approved FY 2020 Redevelopment budget included \$50,000 for outside plaza improvements to the Children's Museum, \$38,200 of which was previously authorized by the Redevelopment Authority for surface improvements and amenities. Details for the proposed sign were not available at that time. The proposed sign would consolidate and replace existing signage located at the front of the building. The building is

a public building owned by Carson City and leased by the Children's Museum.

Agenda Title: For Possible Action: Discussion and possible action to make a recommendation to the Redevelopment Authority regarding the expenditure of up to \$11,800 for a new message sign at the Children's Museum, located at 813 N. Carson Street.

Staff Summary: The approved FY 2020 Redevelopment budget allocations included \$50,000 for outside plaza improvements to the Children's Museum, \$38,200 of which was previously authorized by the RACC and Redevelopment Authority for surface improvements and amenities. Details for the proposed sign were not available at that time. The proposed sign would consolidate and replace existing signage located at the front of the building. The building is a public building owned by Carson City and leased by the Children's Museum.

Proposed Motion: I move to recommend to the Redevelopment Authority approval of the expenditure of up to \$11,800 for the Children's Museum replacement sign, subject to completion of the sign installation by June 30, 2020.

DISCUSSION:

As noted in the above summary, \$50,000 was allocated in the FY 2020 Redevelopment budget to complete improvements at the front of the Children's Museum under the Redevelopment capital improvements program. The RACC and Redevelopment Authority have previously approved plans for front plaza improvements, which are currently under construction. The Children's Museum also proposed a new freestanding message center sign to replace the existing signage at the front of the building, but details of the sign and required approvals from the State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) and Historic Resources Commission (HRC) were not ready at that time. It was noted to the RACC and Redevelopment during the prior approval that the application for the sign would be coming back for approval.

The Children's Museum, with approval of the City's property manager (Public Works Department), has received approval of the proposed sign from the HRC and SHPO. On July 11, 2019, SHPO issued a notice of approval for the proposed sign, subject to removing the existing, non-historic signs in the front of the building including the freestanding sign and the signs on the railings. The HRC approved the proposed sign on September 12, 2019, subject to the same condition required by SHPO. The proposed action on this agenda is required to authorize the expenditure of the budgeted Redevelopment funds for the proposed sign.

The requested funding is proposed to cover the cost of the sign including installation (\$10,900), as well as the cost of the required Special Use Permit application for approval of the sign (\$2,450), if necessary. (The applicant and Redevelopment staff will work with Carson City Facilities Division to see if the City will be the SUP application and, therefore, no SUP fee will be required.)

EXISTING CONDITIONS:



City Planning Division staff, the Historic Resources Commission, and the State Historic Preservation Office have all concluded that the removal of the existing signage at the front of the building and consolidation of signage onto one freestanding sign will improve the appearance of the building.



Application Procedures:

- 1. <u>Applications are due to the Community Development Department by January 15</u> each year in order to be considered by the RACC and Redevelopment Authority in the first round of funding for the following fiscal-year budget (i.e. beginning July 1 of that year).
- The RACC will review Capital Improvement Funding Request applications at its February meeting and make a recommendation to the Redevelopment Authority regarding all requests.
- 3. The Redevelopment Authority will review the applications at its second meeting in March to allocate available Undesignated Redevelopment funds to approved capital improvement projects. Finance will prepare the following fiscal-year tentative budget in accordance with the approved budget allocations.
- 4. Applications submitted after January 15 each year may be considered by the RACC and Redevelopment Authority on a case-by-case basis subject to the availability of Undesignated Redevelopment funds after the initial round of projects are included in the tentative budget for the applicable fiscal year.



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

HISTORIC RESOURCES COMMISSION September 12, 2019

NOTICE OF DECISION

An application was received regarding a request for a sign on property zoned Public Community located at 813 North Carson Street, APN 002-164-01.

The Historic Resources Commission conducted a public hearing on September 12, 2019, in conformance with City and State open meeting requirements and the Historic Resources Commission moved to approve HRC-19-110 finding that the proposal is in conformance with the Secretary of the Interior Guidelines and Standards for Rehabilitation, Carson City Historic District Guidelines, and the Historic Resources Commission policies. The decision is subject to the following conditions of approval.

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

- 1. All development shall be substantially in accordance with the attached site development plan.
- 2. All on and off-site improvements shall conform to City standards and requirements.
- 3. The use for which this permit is approved shall commence within 12 months of the date of final approval. An extension of time must be requested in writing to the Planning Division 30 days prior to the one year expiration date. Should this request not be initiated within one year and no extension granted, the request shall become null and void.
- 4. The applicant must sign and return the Notice of Decision within 10 days of receipt of notification. If the Notice of Decision is not signed and returned within 10 days, then the item may be rescheduled for the next Historic Resources Commission meeting for further consideration.
- 5. The tree located between the building and the sign must be retained to create a visual separation between the two.
- 6. All other external signs and their supports in front of the building on Carson Street must be removed in advance of activation of the proposed sign.
- 7. The support system for the sign will be a square shaped design and not a tube, subject to review and approval by the Chairman.
- 8. The applicant must obtain a Special Use Permit for the sign from the Planning Commission prior to installation.

9. HRC approval is based upon the project complying with the Standards and Guidelines for Rehabilitation, Carson City Historic District Guidelines, the Historic Resources Commission Policies and that the plans as submitted are in general conformance with the Secretary of the Interior's Standards.

The decision was made on a vote of 5 ayes, 0 nays, 2 absent, 0 recusal.
