#### **CONCEPTUAL PARCEL MAP CHECKLIST**

Within 30 days after the Conceptual Parcel Map submittal, Planning Division staff and other applicable departments will meet with the applicant to review the proposed project. Following this meeting, the Planning Division will issue a letter to the applicant (usually via email) informing them of potential issues with the current design and additional application materials needed for the Tentative Parcel Map application submittal.

Provide a variety of housing models and densities within the urbanized area appropriate to the development size, location and surrounding neighborhood context (2.2a, 9.1a)?
Protect environmentally sensitive areas through proper setbacks, dedication, or other mechanisms (3.1b)?
If at the urban interface, provide multiple access points, maintain defensible space (for fires) and are constructed of fire resistant materials (3.3b)?
Sited outside the primary floodplain and away from geologic hazard areas or follow the required setbacks or other mitigation measures (3.3d, e)?
Provide for levels of services (i.e. water, sewer, road improvements, sidewalks, etc.) consistent with the Land Use designation and adequate for the proposed development (Land Use table descriptions)?
If located within an identified Specific Plan Area (SPA), meet the applicable policies of that SPA (Land Use Map, Chapter 8)?
