## **ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER**

The Administrative Orders filed on March 17, 2020, in case # 20 OP 00001 1B, and May 13, 2021, in case # 21 OP 00001 1B are hereby modified.

On February 10, 2022, Governor Stephen Sisolak lifted the mask mandate for the State of Nevada effectively immediately. His decision was based on declining Covid-19 and related variants' infectious rates and hospitalizations.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED effective February 10, 2022, Juvenile Services will no longer be required to wear masks or facial coverings unless meeting with the public and 6 ft. of social distancing is not able to be complied with. The First Judicial District Court adopts the recommendation of the Carson City Health Director to continue to have the public and employees wear masks or facial coverings in the Juvenile Detention Center.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all other provisions in the Administrative Orders filed on March 17, 2020, in case # 20 OP 00001 1B, and May 13, 2021, in case # 21 OP 00001 1B will remain in full force and effect or until modified or rescinded by a subsequent order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the First Judicial District Court Clerk's Office disseminate copies of the order to the Carson City Manager, Carson City District Attorney, Nevada State Public Defender, Division of Child and Family Services and Court Appointed Special Advocates.
