A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE NATIONAL INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (NIMS) AS THE OFFICIAL ALL-HAZARDS INCIDENT RESPONSE SYSTEM FOR CARSON CITY AND APPOINTING THE FIRE CHIEF/EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT DIRECTOR AS THE SINGLE POINT OF CONTACT FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF THE NIMS.

WHEREAS, Homeland Security Presidential Directive 5 (HSPD-5), Management of Domestic Incidents, calls for the establishment of a single, comprehensive National Incident Management System (NIMS); and

WHEREAS, HSPD-5 has established an implementation matrix for local governments to gain compliance with NIMS; and

WHEREAS, the compliance matrix requires the formal adoption of NIMS as the local government's official all-hazards, incident response system; and

WHEREAS, an additional required element of the matrix directs that each local government must appoint a single point of contact to serve as principal NIMS coordinator;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED That Carson City formally adopts, by resolution, the National Incident Management System as the jurisdiction's official all-hazards, incident response system; and

BEIT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Fire Chief/Emergency Management Director shall serve as Carson City's single point of contact and be the principal coordinator for NIMS implementation and Homeland Security programs.
