An assessment of elk damage on Granite Peak Ranch in White Pine County, totaling \$19,170.00, was completed by Department personnel, and submitted for reimbursement by Bruce Hubbard, agent for the property. Per NAC 504.421 Section 1(f), "A loss on one site must be limited to \$10,000, unless the Commission determines that a claimant may be paid more, and there is sufficient money to pay him or her." At its March 26, 2022 meeting, the Nevada Board of Wildlife Commissioners will need to approve the elk damage claim so the Department can pay the claim. The CCCABMW may desire to offer public comment.
