Candidate Statement

As a prosecutor, I have advocated daily to keep citizens safe. Justice Court is the first court to hear criminal cases and decide if bail should be granted and what circumstances a person may be released under. I have completed countless trials and spent thousands of hours on cases in Justice Court. I serve as the District Attorney's representation in Misdemeanor Treatment Court, a specialty court program designed to help offenders address addiction. I am aware of the alternatives to incarceration available to offenders in Carson City and know when it is appropriate to use them. Having an experienced judge helps ensure the law is being followed and all parties are treated justly. Treating all parties fairly includes the voices of victims of crimes who have unique perspectives and a Constitutional Right to be heard. More recently, I have experienced this reality firsthand. I lost my youngest brother to a homicide and that experience showed me how important early decisions in cases are to defendants, victims, and the safety of the public. As Justice of the Peace, I will ensure that victim rights are respected and that the impact on the victim is properly considered in all cases.
