





TOTAL POOL EXPERIENCE


The claims count for all members per year has averaged 506 per open year. Membership doubled between 1998 and 2006, although claims activity appears to have stabilized over the open seven years. Open claims total 224 for the period or about 6% of all incidents and claims incurred.

POOL CLAIMS FREQUENCY



Severity, for the seven open years, based on total loss costs incurred without deduction for excess insurance or deductibles, has averaged \$3,507,895 with the worst year at \$5,769,529. Net of member deductibles and of excess insurance payments, the POOL's retained incurred claims for the open years averaged \$2,316,113 with the peak year (2005) hitting \$2,516,352. On a cost per claim basis the average net per claim cost is \$4,581.
